Home Interior

- Front-loading washer and dryer
- Rocker switches or automated lighting
- Lever handles on doors, not knobs
- No shaggy, high pile carpet or rugs
- Walkways clear of clutter and cords
- Outlets accessible and easy to reach
- Smoke detectors with strobe lights throughout home
- Easy to use or automated thermostat
- Bathroom available on each floor
- Outlets accessible and easy to reach
- No shaggy, high pile carpet or rugs
- All steps/obstacles well lit in contrasting colors
- Handrails extend past stair landings (if applicable)
- Chair Lift/Elevator available (if required)
- WiFi set up and available for visitors
- Emergency communication device (panic button)

Kitchen

- Round counter edges
- Edge of counters a different color than the top
- Low-noise appliances (i.e. dishwasher, microwave)
- Shelves are shallow enough to reach the back, or make use of pull-out shelves/lazy susan
- Side-by-side refrigerator for easy access
- Appliances/outlets accessible and easy to reach
- Lever controls on all faucets
- Spray hose for easier washing
- Clear, understandable controls on front of appliances
- Stove with clear display that indicates hot areas
- Side open oven doors
- Non-slip floor surface

Bathroom

- Seat in tub/shower
- Walk-in tub/shower (low rise)
- Grab bars for bath and toilet
- Counter edges rounded to prevent injury
- Easy, D-shapes cabinet/drawer handles
- Elevated toilet seat or lift
- Lever controls on all faucets
- Slip-resistant floors
- Well-lit closets and cabinets

Bedroom(s)

- All items can be reached from a standing position
- Rocker switches or automated lighting
- No shaggy, high pile carpet or rugs
- Floor clear of clutter and cords
- Outlets accessible and easy to reach

Garage

- Automatic garage door opener
- Well-lit, visible steps and floor transitions
- Non-slip flooring or mats in hazardous areas
- Ramp to front door with handrails

Exterior

- Automated lighting system with timer
- Well-lit, visible stairs, transitions, and pathways
- Security system with front door camera
- Lever handles on doors, not knobs
- Ramp to front door threshold with handrails
- Walkways free of clutter and cords
- No mats/rugs (tripping hazard)

Wheelchair Users

- Knee space under sink/cooktop
- Wide transfer space for bath and toilet
- Doors wide enough for chair
- Sufficient space to turn around in all rooms/closets
- All steps replaced with ramps
- All ramps angled and secured properly with handrails
- Switches/outlets accessible from seated position
- Counter heights adjusted for seated use
- Grab bars for transitions in/out of chair
