It's hard to believe it is Advent already. Time is a vapor in our lives! It is almost a shock that it's time for the prophetic voices to call us home once again and to bring us hope. When I was younger, I always wondered why Advent did not begin with the Christmas story, Joseph and Mary, Angels and Shepherds, Magi and the babe in a manger, but it begins with prophetic voices. We long for and await the things to come. Advent calls us to the reality of the situation of our world - the prophetic call to look closely at the world we inhabit. Are we even close to the kingdom of God, "on earth as it is in heaven"? In the midst of a Pandemic, politics and all the violence that surrounds us, Jesus still reigns as King over all. Yet, we live, like the prophets of old, in an age of wealth and prosperity with so much moral complacency and spiritual bankruptcy. Advent calls us to be honest and look closely at our shortcomings. This is why the prophetic voices call out to us once more, to "repent, the kingdom of heaven is at hand." We light the Advent candles as a beacon to call us home rather than as a countdown to Christmas. Christ is our light in the darkness. As a church we are to light the way for others to find their way home again. Home to a place that transforms us and calls us to God's righteousness. Home is Jesus Christ born within us once again, born once again into a dark world.

Hospitality is important. We welcome Jesus who has already come, and we anticipate Christ's coming into this disturbed world once again to bring hope, love, peace and joy. May our arms be open to receive all who walk through our doors, longing for a glimpse of Jesus, longing to be made whole, and longing to know love and fellowship. With these thoughts in mind, may we remember who we are and whose we are? I leave you with an Advent song as we begin our journey home once again:

Creator of the stars of night, your people's everlasting light,
O Christ, Redeemer of us all, we pray you, hear us when we call.
When earth drew on to darkest night, You came, but not in splendor bright,
Not as a king, but the child of Mary, virgin mother mild.
At your great name, majestic now, all knees must bend, all hearts must bow;

Trinity's 2021 income exceeded 2020's numbers again in November, **BUT** we are still a few thousand dollars short of covering our budget expenses this year – sanitization measures, maintenance, and a few other areas exceeded our 2021 budget estimates.

Projected budget income needed for December to cover all expenses for 2021, not including the remaining apportionments, is \$25,367.

Projected Holston Conference apportionment money needed to meet our 100% tithe at the end of 2021 is \$6,500. 

Good Samaritan Thanksgiving Baskets:

On a cold Saturday morning, November 20, Good Samaritan Center volunteers distributed boxes filled with all the makings for

Thanksgiving Dinner to more than 300 Loudon County families. Each family received boxes with stuffing mix, cake mix and frosting, brown & serve rolls, and canned goods such as green beans, corn, and candied yams. They also receive a \$15 gift certificate from Food City which can be used for ham, turkey or fresh vegetables to complete their meal. Clients are pre-certified at GSC and given a voucher. They begin lining up by 8 am for the 9 am start time. When they present their voucher, they received the Food City certificate and proceed in their car to the next stations where food boxes are loaded for them. The final stop this year was for a 4-pack of toilet paper, courtesy of a generous donation from Tate & Lyle. St. Thomas Catholic Church generously makes their parking lot available for the event.

Thank you, Trinity, for begin part of this annual community event, ensuring that every family in Loudon County has the opportunity to have a Thanksgiving feast. Thank you, Jo Alison Cortez for organizing our collection to help provide the Thanksgiving baskets. Our church people donated a total of \$550. Good Samaritan staff and volunteers consider this one of the highlights of the year. This year we missed our long-time volunteer, Sol Thomas, who worked in the pantry for many years and was always part of the Thanksgiving basket distribution.

A buffet luncheon catered by Calhoun's was provided by the Thomas family




