

Why I Attend Trinity






LAKE JUNALUSKA, NC

Thank you from the family of Sarah Smith Ellison

As many of you know, we lost our sweet mother, Sarah Smith Ellison, in late January of this year. She was diagnosed on July 28, 2020 with pancreatic cancer and, as is so often the case with this type of cancer, Mom's cancer was very advanced when the doctors found it. Sarah was able to take two rounds of chemo and did enjoy some good months before the cancer began to take its toll on her body and mind. On January 6, we moved her to our home in Lenoir City where my siblings and I and our family friends were with her around the clock. We were fortunate to have talented and caring nurses who also stayed with us at all times.

I share the foregoing to let each of you know that during this exceptionally difficult time, Trinity was also with us around the clock! Before Mom died, members of Trinity – past and present - showed up to visit, move furniture around, deliver flowers and generally help us with the things a family needs in such terrible circumstances. You called, texted, emailed, wrote cards (the cards!), visited and somehow carried us through our hard days. Following Sarah's death, Trinity fed us and helped us give Sarah the kind of funeral she envisioned and then you made donations in honor of our mother. The continual presence of Trinity seemed to be God's very presence with us and my siblings and I took great comfort from your support. We remain mindful and grateful for your efforts.
