I managed to purchase a few small things for them, but it wasn't what they had asked for. I could not bring myself to tell them the truth. It was a burden for a young mother to carry. I prayed that God would provide, but more so I asked that God would help them understand.

Christmas Eve arrived and early in the afternoon, I heard a knock at my door. It was a neighbor that lived in Carter's Valley, where we lived at the time, who I barely knew. She had put together dinner for us for Christmas Eve, ham and all the fixings. It was such a surprise I cried tears of joy and was so grateful for her thoughtfulness and generosity. After Brandon and Christina went to bed, I heard another knock at the door. This time it was my dad and brother. They had two boxes; one was a bicycle and the other a baby doll highchair. I had mentioned to Mom that I didn't know what to do, but never dreamed of them buying the gifts. Dad and Robbie proceeded to assemble the bicycle quickly as well as the highchair. Again, I cried tears of joy for the thoughtfulness and generosity of my parents. It reminded me that in good times and bad, God is truly with us. May your Advent and Christmas Season be filled with God's presence and surprising joy and peace. Even in Blue Christmases God is with us! Glory be to God!






