

During this Lenten Season it is my prayer that your hearts will be filled with God's goodness, grace, forgiveness and love. This is such a beautiful season of the year, a time for us to look at our lives closely, not for shame or guilt, but for transformation. I read **Bishop Debra Wallace-Padgett's blog** that can also be found on Holston.org, about the four actions of repentance and it touched my heart. I hope it will touch your heart as well.

Lent consists of the 40 days immediately prior to Easter, excluding Sundays. Though Lent was originally a period of fasting and preparation for the baptism of new believers, this significant season of the year has evolved into a time of penance for all Christfollowers. So, as we begin Lent today, I am highlighting repentance.

*Repentance sounds like a deeply theological word that is daunting, distant, and discouraging. In reality, though, it is a common and uncomplicated practice! Today, I will name 4 actions that lead to repentance.* 

Action 1: Recognition

Repentance begins with us recognizing that we are going in the wrong direction. This is what the prophet Isaiah is talking about when calling the people to "loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free." (Isaiah 58:6) We can apply this to our social structures. The psalmist personalizes the need to repent when he writes in Psalm 51 "For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me." (Psalm 51:3)

Where in your life are you going in the wrong direction? During this Lenten season, will you join me in identifying those areas of life where we need to change direction in order to walk more fully in Jesus' way?

Action 2: Sorrowful Confession

Repentance is about more than recognizing that we are off track. It continues as we experience sorrow for hurting God and others and confess our sin, asking God's forgiveness. The prophet Joel states this beautifully when he says, "Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning." (Joel 2:12)

Where in your life do you feel deep sorrow for hurting another person and/or disappointing God? Will you join me in seeking God's forgiveness for our wrong attitudes, words, and actions?



Action 3: Forgiving Others

Jesus teaches the disciples to pray. Halfway into the prayer, Jesus says to God, "And forgive us our debts as we also have forgiven our debtors." (Matthew 9:12) So, repentance requires that **we** forgive those who have hurt **us**. True repentance does not allow us to hang onto grudges and ill feelings to others. Forgiving those who have caused us pain is not about earning God's love and grace. Rather it is in response to all that God has done for us through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Is there someone in your life you need to forgive for hurting you or a loved one? Are you harboring resentment toward a person or group of people whose actions or attitudes have made your life harder? Though forgiving others is not always fast or easy, Christ-followers strive to forgive as Jesus forgives us.

Action 4: Change Direction

In his sermon "Salvation by Faith," John Wesley speaks of repentance as an act of faith that leads to conversion. (Sermon 1: "Salvation by Faith," III.4) This means that we change direction so that we are walking God's pathway.

And in the process, we are transformed. This is what II Corinthians 5:20b-21 describes. "... we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." As we repent, we change more and more into the likeness of Christ. And we grow in our capacity to walk in the right direction.

How do you sense God is leading you to change direction? What will it require of you? What is the next step for you to take in turning around?

May this Lenten journey from the wilderness to the cross transform our lives, give us new direction and turn our hearts and lives back toward our God of infinite mercy!

### <u>One Heart</u>





### Trinity Treasurer's Report February 28, 2023

A Trinity 2023 Budget of \$213,085 has now been approved. Giving in January and February 2023 was strong, and we are on pace to allow us to meet the budget. We adopted a policy at the last Finance Committee meeting to pay our conference and district tithes on a monthly basis. Thanks to your generous giving we will be able to keep our commitments.

#### **KEEP UP THE GOOD WORK.**

Because some annual bills such as taxes, insurance, service contracts, etc. are paid in January and February, the budget/expenses are skewed until mid-year.

The Trustees have been active and here are the Trustee accomplishments over the past six months:

- One of the two AC compressors in the sanctuary 15 ton unit was replaced.
- The water heater in the janitorial closet began leaking and this was replaced. The water heater feeds the bathroom sinks, janitorial sink and children's room sink.
- We held a work day in October to demo the rotted carport on the rental property and clean up the over grown fence rows.
- We had the large pecan tree on the rental property cut down and removed. This tree was a potential hazard to the church building and rental property. We are also in the process of getting the large maple tree on the rental property cut down. The maple tree is rotten in the middle as can be seen by the sizable hole in the trunk.
- The kitchen hood vent fan had seized and the fan motor has been replaced.
- The door from the pastor's office to the fellowship hall has been removed and the wall closed up.
- We are in the process of installing a garbage disposal in the kitchen with this expected to be complete in the very near future.
- We are currently working through the bid process to select a company to seal the entry points into the attic over the sanctuary and rid this space of the squirrel infestation.
- We are also working to obtain bids to remedy the water intrusion problem along the front of the building between the building and the ramp. Once this problem is remedied, we will begin repair work on the walls inside along the front of the building.
- We plan to begin work to repair the ceiling in the New Vision Sunday school class-room.
- We held a work day in February to clean out the storage area of the attic where years of old unusable items had accumulated and have now been hauled off.

# Lenoir City Children Say Thank You to Trinity!






