Thank you, Trinity for caring!






### **Good Samaritan School Backpacks**

# Missions & Outreach





On Sunday, June 22nd, Trinity celebrated our first Peace with Justice Sunday, one of the six special Sundays offered in our yearly church calendar. We'd like to extend that awareness by sharing how we can continue to understand and implement the action of Peace in our daily lives.

We begin by sharing Our Social Creed which draws from the Church's Christian beliefs and Wesleyan practices to express its solidarity with the working class and commitment to fair and just labor practices. It is a historic and sacred testament to our social witness as a denomination. The UMC encourages congregations to incorporate it into their worship occasionally to remind congregants of the denomination's commitment to justice and equality for all people.



### **OUR SOCIAL CREED**

We believe in God, Creator of the world; and in Jesus Christ, the Redeemer of creation. We believe in the Holy Spirit, through whom we acknowledge God's gifts, and we repent of our sin in misusing these gifts to idolatrous ends.

We affirm the natural world as God's handiwork and dedicate ourselves to its preservation, enhancement, and faithful use by humankind.

We joyfully receive for ourselves and others the blessings of community, sexuality, marriage, and the family.

We commit ourselves to the rights of men, women, children, youth, young adults, the aging, and people with disabilities; to improvement of the quality of life; and to the rights and dignity of all persons.

We believe in the right and duty of persons to work for the glory of God and the good of themselves and others and in the protection of their welfare in so doing; in the rights to property as a trust from God, collective bargaining, and responsible consumption; and in the elimination of economic and social distress. We dedicate ourselves to peace throughout the world, to the rule of justice and law among nations, and to individual freedom for all people of the world.

We believe in the present and final triumph of God's Word in human affairs and gladly accept our commission to manifest the life of the gospel in the world. Amen.
