1. Hill Country Winery Tour & Fredericksburg, Texas

8:00 a.m.—5:00 p.m.

Cost: \$80/person (Lunch on Your Own in Fredericksburg)

Take a leisurely bus ride to the beautiful Texas Hill Country. There are over 30 Texas wineries in this area and we will be visiting Becker Farms Estate Winery for a wine tasting, or enjoy a Charcuterie-Cheese Board, with plenty of time to select some to take home.

<u>Lunch will be on your Own</u>

After having some great wines, we will head over to have lunch in the historic town of Fredericksburg, Texas. The various foods leave you wanting to taste everything. From German to Mexican food, something for everyone. Lunch will be on your own.

Fredericksburg was founded in 1846 and named after Prince Frederick of Prussia. This beautiful little town Because there are so many different restaurants in Freder- icksburg, Old-time German residents often referred to Fredericksburg as Fritztown, a nickname that is still used in some businesses. The town is also notable as the home of Texas German, a dialect spoken by the first generations of German settlers who initially refused to learn English. Fredericksburg is the birthplace of Fleet Admiral Chester Nimitz. It is the sister city of Montabaur, Germany. On October 14, 1970, the Fredericksburg Historic District was added to the National Register of Historic Places in Texas and is worth seeing, if you wish.

Dedicated to all those who served in the Pacific War, the Admiral Museum, George Bush Gallery of the Pacific War and the Pacific Combat Zone are all part of this complex.



2. Geology Tour – Natural Bridge Caverns & New Braunfels, Texas 8:00 a.m.—5:00 p.m.

#### Cost: \$80/person NOTE: This Field Trip is limited to Forty (40) people

San Antonio is surrounded by remarkable geological features. It sits right on the edge of the Balcones Fault system and the Edwards Plateau. The unique geology of the area plays an important role in creating the stunning beauty all around us – the amazing hills, the escarpment, the aquifers and cave



systems. On this trip, we will talk about some of these things as well as witness the beauty around us. You will also receive a booklet explaining the basic geology of Texas and how the area around San Antonio fits into the puzzle.

Natural Bridge Caverns is our first stop – just 30 minutes away. We will have a little shopping time in the gift shop before our tour starts at 10:00 am. We are taking the New Hidden Wonders tour and will see the newly opened rooms, a dazzling sound and light show with a conveyor ride back to the surface! This new "B.A.T." system (Belt Assisted Transport) is the only conveyor system ride out of a cavern in the world. The tour duration is a little over an hour with a walking distance of ONLY 1/4 of a mile.

From the Cavern, we will head to New Braunfels, Texas – just a few minutes away.

You can enjoy the afternoon with <u>Lunch on your own</u> and shopping. We will return to the bus at 3:15 pm to head back to our hotel.


She will explain how her twin brother, Vernon, decided that she needed to find out about a spill in the Gulf of Mexico that was part of the Deep-Water Horizon, or so the news media and feds thought. She will discuss the now famous and retired Gulf of Mexico Hurricane, Ivan, and his/her destruction of Taylor Energy

Platform MC-20A. She will discuss how the federal government and the Gulf Coast States of Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and Florida did not realize or chose to not realize this spill had happened until the Environmental Non-Profits decided that there was a problem and it was not the British Petroleum Company's Deep-Water Horizon or Macondo Oil Spill in the Gulf of Mexico.


Val will give the biography of the owner of the platform and a brief history of the platform and how many wells were attached. We will also discuss the relative placement of the platform to the edge of the shelf and the deep water in the Gulf of Mexico. She will discuss the lawsuits and the 'Acts of God' as well as the possible capping of the wells that were attached to the platform.

# INDUSTRY LUNCHEON Scott A. Angelle 12:00 pm - 1:30 pm



Mr. Scott A. Angelle is a native of Breaux Bridge, Louisiana. He is one of nine children, raised in a middle class family. He learned at an early age the value of teamwork and how to fight for every inch, for the right things.

His political career began within the St. Martin Parish Police Jury and was later elected as the Parish's first President. He was appointed by Governor Kathleen Blanco in 2004, as Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and Chairman of the State's Mineral Board and served in the position until August 2012, when he left to seek office of Public Service Commissioner.

He was appointed as the 52<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant Governor by Governor Bobby Jindal, and was the state's point person to negotiate an end to the Gulf of Mexico drilling moratorium. He also serves as a member of the Louisiana State University Board of Supervisors, and is chairman of the state's water resources Commission. He assumed the Commissionership of the Public Service Commission District 2, on January 1, 2013 and his term ended on December 3, 2018.

While serving in these capacities, Scott developed a deep appreciation and respect for the men and women across the U.S. working in the various energy sectors that help energize our great nation. One of the ways to elevate and celebrate these workers is to recognize their contributions to **Balance the 3E's – Energy, Environment and Economy.** For over 30 years, Scott has been passionate about American energy and how it continues to fuel our democracy, innovation, technology, businesses – large and small and homes across the country.

Scott created USA Energy Workers to recognize the value of our traditional and renewable energy workers and the many positive contributions they have made in energizing and building the America we know and love.
