ELCA Youth Gathering

The kids and I just returned from an amazing trip to the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans, over the last week. We learned, sang, danced, and ate amazing food.

I know that the kids will be anxious to share their stories of the gathering with you. They're heading out on another trip this weekend - sometimes PK's (Pastor Kids) get to go on trips with Dad's church too – this time it is a mystery mission trip, where they don't know the destination that they're heading to, but they know that they're planning to work hard for someone that needs some help.

In New Orleans, we gathered with 16,000 Youth from around the world (mostly from the United States, but not all). One day we had a service project (our group learned about anti-racism efforts). Another day, we gathered with other youth from our Synod to worship. Our kids were all in the band, leading worship for 1,800 other youth participants – this was a definite highlight for me! Another day was spent in a huge convention center with all kinds of interesting exhibits and opportunities for youth to learn about how to connect their faith with ministries of the church.

Each evening, we gathered in a mass gathering experience where we listened to powerful and relatable speakers, we sang songs, and watched dancers twirl beautifully to the music. Hearing 16,000 youth sing together, all singing praise for God is an experience unlike any other. This was my fifth Youth Gathering trip I've led – they have all been special. Yet, I'll say that being with my own children in this sea of youth is an experience I will treasure in my heart forever.

I want to thank you, people of All Saints, for praying for us, for sending cooling towels for the hurricane relief kits (I heard we packed 3,000-4,000 kits for the people of New Orleans!) and for the gift of the time to spend with the youth of our church. The next youth gathering is in Minneapolis in 2027, and I'd like to take a large group of youth from All Saints. Together, we can make that happen.

I'm singing the same song again...Yes, we have an amazing and exceptional Building and Grounds team! A couple of recent efforts include:

- Jim Wall brought his lift into the gym to replace some ceiling lights that were flickering (this is not a small thing...have you seen the height of that ceiling?). Thank you Jim!
- After having our furnaces maintained this year, the servicing company recommended a repair to one of our units (damage from some mice) that would cost us almost \$1,000...or we purchase a new furnace and AC unit for more than \$8,000! Carl Westerdale and his brother-in-law have some experience in this area, so they took a look at the unit. After purchasing a part costing less than \$25, they were able to make the repair for us. This is a HUGE cost savings! Thank you Carl, and your network of repair folks!
- Jim Dralle organized (and simplified) the church cleaning chemicals we have on-site. He also purchased new paper towel holders to replace the hands-free electronic ones, which didn't work well. Thank you Jim!
- Several folks on the team worked on organizing the maintenance closets.


Join ASLC for a fun time on August 4th at 12:50pm to

Elafadhili Miley is one of the students sponsored by All Saints, and he is in his first year of college, studying Environmental Science in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. His father was the first graduate of our educational partnership program.

Dar es Salaam is 11 hours by bus from his home in Songoro, and he is not able to see his family very often. As all of us have done, we have found a church home in the city or area where we are going to school. We have had Elifadhili in our prayers recently, as he was recovering from a bout of malaria. Currently, he is doing very well and appreciates our prayers for him. The following information is from Elafadhili, and he as given his permission to put it in our newsletter:



"I wanted to share with you the exciting news about today's youth service at our congregation in Dar es Salaam. It was a wonderful event where young people from our community took the lead in organizing and participating in the services.
