For many years, All Saints' members have made Christmas brighter for families that attend our sister church, Hephatha Lutheran Church in Milwaukee. This year, Pastor Mary Martha has again given us the names of five families; all five are ones that we sponsored last year. In these five families are 22 people who regularly attend Hephatha. It is our goal each year to provide two gifts per person and a Christmas meal by giving Pick N Save or Walmart gift cards to each family.

#### **ELCA: Human Sexuality - Gift & Trust**

From the Greater Milwaukee Synod, that we may be informed of the work of the wider ELCA. See the opportunity to offer feedback on the process.

In 2022, the Churchwide Assembly authorized two reconsiderations (see pages 4-5 and 11 of this Assembly action summary) of the Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust (2009) social statement:

- Reconsideration #1: A review of specific text references that "would consider the import that
  marriage legally is now a covenant between individuals;" review specific wording "in light of
  public acceptance of marriage of same-gender and gender-non-conforming couples;" and
  "consider references to diversity of family configurations;" and
- Reconsideration #2: A fresh consideration of the "church's current concept of the four positions of bound conscience" found on pages 19-21 of Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust.

#### You Can Change a Life

Members of all Saints have supported 55-75 secondary school students every year with funds contributed during All Saints scholarship appeal. The government does not pay for education in Tanzania and it is difficult or impossible for most Songoro families to pay secondary school fees. Many families are subsistence farmers that live on 1-3 acres with annual incomes of \$500 - \$600.

Our partnership has focused on education since 2005. This gives the members of Songoro Lutheran Church the tools to improve their standard of living and increase their contributions to the congregation. The congregation has been adding community ministry programs to help the needy in the region.

Fees for attending state operated secondary schools are \$70 - \$80. Fees for attending private secondary schools are \$250 - \$300. The education at private schools makes meaningful employment or advanced education more likely. Contributions of any size are appreciated and are changing lives. Contribution envelopes are available in the pews and at our narthex display. Please note Songoro Scholarship Program when giving on line.

Our scholarship program has sponsored 22 students for their college education. Several potential Songoro college students are praying that patrons will be found.
