A Look Back at 2022

In so many ways, 2022 was an extraordinary year at All Saints. We focus here on the tremendous support that our family and friends gave to Human Concerns ministries.

In January, the Campaign for Songoro Clinic Beds was ongoing with the hope of raising enough money for the Clinic to purchase ten hospital beds. Our lofty goal was approximately \$2,700 and we wondered if that was possible, especially right on the heels of Christmas! With donations from many generous people and an anonymous donor who matched anyone who contributed \$270 (the price of one bed). . . just over \$5,000 was raised!! The money was sent to the Clinic and the Clinic board ordered not only the ten beds but were able to order additional equipment that was critical to the operation of the clinic. WOW!

Lem, our college student from Hephatha started another semester at MATC. He used the \$500 that we gave him to buy equipment for his electrician classes.

In February, you supported our first Cookie Walk in two important ways. Many of you made and contributed delicious cookies, bars and candy. And then, even more of you bought cookies! Again, the support went above our highest hopes and this fundraiser was a great success.

In March, we were able to send funds to these deserving organizations:

- \$250 to World Central Kitchen
- \$500 to Pine Ridge Reservation of the Lakota (for heating bills)
- \$250 to Pastor Roy for his Good Samaritan Fund

In April, twenty-three Hephatha families were able to buy Easter meals with the gift cards that we sent. So many All Saints members signed up to sponsor these families!

In May, we participated in the Spring Market by having a plant sale. Once again, we asked for contributions of perennial plants and once again we had a huge response with lots of plants to sell.

In June, Kathy and Bill Neubert organized a group of members to serve a meal at the Hope Center and others donated milk and cookies for the meal.

In September, our pledge to provide \$500 to Lem for college expenses was met.

In November, our Hephatha families were able to shop for their Thanksgiving meal thanks to All Saints sponsors. A second meal was served at the Hope Center.
