You have become an inclusive Reconciling in Christ congregation, have strengthened your partnership with the Songoro Lutheran Church, helped build a community medical center there, and continue to send their children to secondary school and college which, in conjunction with the Mt. Meru Coffee Project, does economic justice by raising the standard of living in their community and region. Your relationship with Hephatha Lutheran Church remains solid, doing justice through your support of their Strong Baby Sanctuary project, Thanksgiving and Easter meals, and providing financial assistance for students attending college or vocational training. Cross+Stitch ministry continues to support mission work with quilts, blankets, clothing, and baby layettes. By God's grace, faithful leadership by your lay leaders, your willingness to serve, and your faithful support, All Saints will not just survive this pastoral transition, but will continue to thrive and flourish, as you serve God by serving others!

I have been blessed to be your pastor. And I'm thankful for your love and support for me and my family. I care deeply for all of you at All Saints, and will hold you in prayer as you work through the transition process and call a new pastor, who will bring their own gifts, talents and passion for ministry. The synod will be walking with you through the transition process. You are in good hands.

As my season as your pastor draws to a close, I will be doing a wedding at church on June 18th and will then be taking accrued vacation time. My last day as pastor at All Saints is June 30th, after which I will not be available for any baptisms, weddings, funerals, visits or other pastoral acts.
