First Reading: Ephesians 2:11 - 22

Remember that at one time you Gentiles by birth were slandered as “the uncircumcised” by those who are “the circumcised,” while, indeed, their circumcision was of human origin. Remember:

- You were at that time without Christ.
- You were aliens from the community of Israel.
- You were strangers to the covenants of promise.
- You had no hope.
- You were without God in this world.

But now, in Christ Jesus, you who were once far off are now brought near by the blood of Christ. He is our peace.

- In his flesh he made both groups into one.
- He broke down the dividing wall that is the hostility between us.
- He abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances.
- In himself he created one new humanity in place of two.
- Thus, he made peace.

He reconciled both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death our hostility.

Then, he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and you who were near, and he gave to both one access through the one Spirit of the Father.

So, you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints, and you are members of the household of God, that is built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord. And, in him you also are built together in spirit into one dwelling place for God.

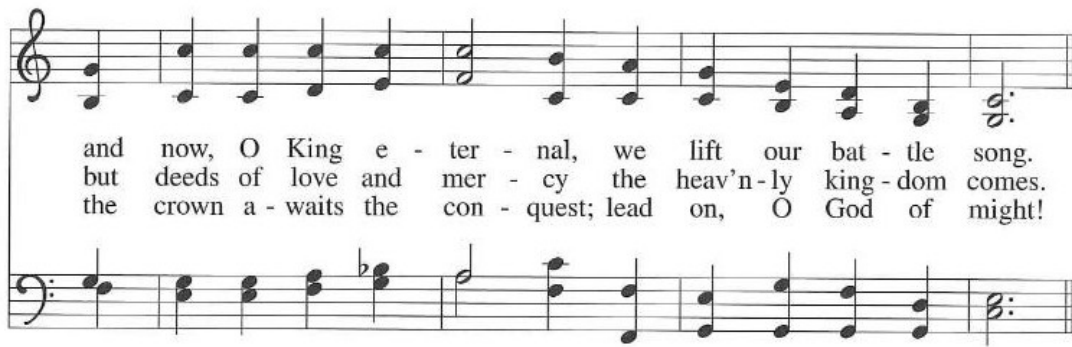
