

Acts 2:1-4

When the day of Pentecost came, all the believers were gathered together in one place. Suddenly, there was a noise from the sky that sounded like a strong wind blowing, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what looked like tongues of fire that spread out and touched each person there. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to talk in other languages, as the Spirit enabled them to speak.

Acts 2:5-8

There were Jews living in Jerusalem, religious people who had come from every country in the world. When they heard this noise, a large crowd gathered. They were all excited, because each one of them heard the believers talking in their own language. In amazement and wonder they exclaimed, "These people who are talking like this are Galileans! How is it, then, that all of us hear them speaking in our own native languages?

Amazed & confused, they kept asking each other, "What does this mean?"

Then Peter stood up with the other 11 apostles and in a loud voice began to speak to the crowd: "This is what the prophet Joel spoke about: 'This is what I will do in the last days, God says: I will pour out My Spirit on everyone. Your sons and daughters will proclaim my message; your youth will see visions, and your aged will dream dreams. Yes, on both men and women, I will pour out My Spirit in those days, and

they will proclaim My message. I will perform miracles in the sky above and wonders on the earth below. There will be blood, fire and thick smoke; the sun will be darkened, and the moon will turn red as blood, before the great and glorious Day of the Lord comes. And then, whoever calls out...whoever calls out... whoever calls out to the Lord for help will be saved.'
