The mission of the Human Concerns Team is very simple and focused: to support people and groups in need. An important aspect of this mission is to support organizations both close to home and further away. On January 5th, we had the meeting that we all look forward to, the meeting during which we are able to offer donations.

But where does this money come from? It comes primarily from Scrip sales! Every time a Scrip card is sold, our Human Concerns Scrip fund grows. Rebates from Scrip retailers range from 1.5% to 15%; sometimes retailers run a special where the rebate reaches 18%! All of those rebates accumulate throughout the year but most robustly during the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons.

Thanks to your support of the Scrip Program, we are able to send donations to the following:

- Kettle Moraine Food Pantry, All Saints \$250
- Hope Center, Waukesha \$250
- Pine Ridge Energy Matching Fund, Pine Ridge, ND \$250
- Reservation Outreach which also supports the Lakota of Pine Ridge, ND \$250

That's a total of \$1,000! *Every dollar that we earn through selling gift cards goes to help others.* That is what our mission is all about and we thank you for making this possible.

to the current date. Remember: it's important to turn in those past dated receipts ASAP to get our credit before Sentry won't accept them.


We'd love to have more families participate or if you know of someone who is a frequent Delafield Sentry Shopper, have them save their receipts for you to turn into church.

Secondary School (High School) Fees

Are not entirely paid by the government in Tanzania. Fees for attending state operated secondary schools are \$70 - \$80. Fees for attending private secondary schools are \$250 - \$300. The education at private schools makes meaningful employment or advanced education even more likely. Contributions of any size are appreciated and are changing lives.

Are you unsure how to order RaiseRight or Scrip gift cards? You buy the gift cards at face value, and ASLC earns a 1-18% rebate on the cards. All of the monies earned on the gift cards go to support our missions! Here are some simple steps for buying gift cards at the Scrip table on Sundays.

- Use an order blank you can get at the back table after church.
 - Stop by the table at any time to pick up an order blank to see what gift cards are typically available each week. That would be a perfect starting point!
- When you are ready to order, use cash or a check to buy gift cards at the table.
- Come by the table after the service and chat with Barb, Kathy, or Sue to help place your order.
 - Complete an order form and pay for your cards at that time. If the cards are not in stock, then we will place an order for you. It might be a week or two before your cards are in.

That is it for buying gift cards in person at the Scrip table—Easy Peasy!

Special Notes: Visa gift cards do not have an activation fee when ordering through RaiseRight, amounts are \$25, 50, 100, 250; travel gift cards can be purchased online or in person—think Southwest, Delt, Uber, Lyft, Airbnb, and most hotels/cruises, gas cards can be ordered for travel, like Kwik-Trip, BP, Shell, 76, Casey's, Marathon, Circle K, Mobil, and Holiday; most chain restaurants will have cards available.
