

Happy Canada Day from SACHA



AN ANGEL ON THE ICE



During the summer months of my childhood a skating program was offered at the McIntyre Arena. The program brought together many young skaters who showed promise for the future. Participants came from across Canada and the United States. We were privileged to have Barbara Ann Scott train with her coach, Sheldon Galbraith, at the "Mac". Every Thursday evening, a Pop Concert was featured at the arena and all the young skaters took to the ice to dazzle the spectators with their spins and jumps.

One particular warm spring evening in April, 1948, is forever etched in my memory. It was that evening that Barbara Ann Scott, dressed in a delicate white skating costume, appeared on the ice. As the music began to play, a film of white mist hovered over the ice surface. Barbara Ann Scott, so petite and graceful, skated to "Ave Maria".

Her performance was absolutely breathtaking. You could not even hear the whisper of her blades cutting the ice. It was like she was floating on air. It was as though the heavens had opened up, allowing this beautiful angel to appear out of the clouds to entertain us with her intricate footwork. The crowd was in awe. At the end of her performance, you could not hear a pin drop. Then, the crowd gave a thunderous roar of approval.

What a night it was! I think I was eight years old at the time, but I knew I had just witnessed something extraordinary. I have not seen anything as moving as this since. I wish someone had recorded this performance on film so it could be viewed again and again. I'm sure that many will recall this memorable evening at the Mac.

Thank you to Jane Vettor for sharing the souvenir programs obtained from her grandfather, Arnold Greer.



A LEGACY LIVES ON



An unexpected post from "Father Les Costello, Public Figure" came across my Facebook feed on Friday, May 13th, 2016. As many SOS readers know, the former Stanley Cup Champion turned Roman Catholic priest died in December of 2002, years before Facebook was even launched.

Curious, I did some sleuthing and discovered that the page was newly created with the purpose of remembering Father Les Costello and all the charitable work that he did. I "liked" the page and over the next few days was treated to a stream of old photos and links to newspaper articles and videos about "Father Hockey, the Schumacher Saint". Thinking that readers of the SOS might be interested in the backstory, I reached out to the page administrator.

Turns out, the page owner left Timmins almost 40 years ago. He met Father Les on only a few occasions, but the priest left a lasting impression on the then young boy. His purpose in creating the Facebook page is to share details of Father Les' life and good deeds with a broader audience Ultimately, he hopes the deceased priest and former NHLer might be inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame and that perhaps someone might be inspired, as Hollywood director Francis Ford Coppola once was, to create a movie about Father Costello and the Flying Fathers.

The Facebook page has been renamed "Tribute to Father Les Costello - RIP" and is worth visiting: www.facebook.com/Tribute-to-Father-Les-Costello-RIP-127026007703824/. An account is not required. In less than a month, the page has been "liked" 875+ times and certain posts have reached thousands of people. The page administrator is overwhelmed by the positive response from the online community. That said, he wishes to remain anonymous and out of the limelight.

Although it barely scratches the surface, the following brief biography should paint a picture for any SOS readers who did not know Father Les.


Les Costello was born February 16, 1928 in South Porcupine. Les was an outstanding hockey player as a boy and went on to win the Memorial Cup in 1945 and 1947 while playing for St. Michael's College of the University of Toronto. During the 1947-48 season, he donned the blue and white jersey of the NHL's Toronto Maple Leafs.

That season, the Leafs defeated the Red Wings to win the Stanley Cup; Costello contributed two goals and three assists during the playoffs. In 1950, in the prime of his career, Les Costello became (and remains) the only NHL player to leave the game for the priesthood. He entered St. Augustine's seminary and was ordained in 1957. Eventually, Ft. Costello found a way to put his love of the game to good use. In 1962, he cofounded the Flying Fathers, a team of skating priests recruited from across Canada. The team played more than 1000 exhibition charity games and raised \$4 million.

Father Les was a people's priest; a great storyteller, a joker, and never one to take himself too seriously. His true passion was helping the less fortunate. His main mission (named after St. Martin

de Porres) operated out of the rectory and supplied food, furniture and clothes to the needy.


Father Les became the priest at St. Alphonsus in Schumacher in 1979. He remained there until his death on December 10, 2002. He died at age 74 due to a head injury sustained at a Flying Fathers game Kincardine, ON. His funeral, attended by more than 2200 mourners, was held at the McIntyre Arena.

A TASTE OF SCHUMACHER

Frozen Strawberry Squares

Contributed by Marilyn (Pupich) McAlpine

A lamb feast was never complete without this special dessert, cool and refreshing on a hot summer day.

- Mix together, then spread in a shallow pan:
 cup flour
 - 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
 - ½ cup chopped walnuts
 - ½ cup melted butter
- 2. Bake for 20 minutes at 350F. Stir occasionally.
- 3. Place 2/3 of crumb mixture in a 9" by 13" pan. Press down firmly to form a base.
- 4. Whip a cup of whipping cream and refrigerate.
- 5. Combine:
 - 2 egg whites
 - 2/3 cup of white sugar
 - 10oz. package of partially thawed strawberries 2 tsps. lemon juice
- 6. Beat on high speed for up to 10 minutes. When light and fluffy, fold in the whipped cream.
- 7. Spread over base. Top with remaining crumbs.
- 8. Cover and freeze overnight.
- 9. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.


