The postcard inscription reads: The McIntyre Gold Mine No.11 Shaft Headframe, built in 1927,


is a monument to Timmins' legendary mining history. Reaching over 40 ft into the sky, this iconic headframe oversees Pearl Lake and lights up at night, sometimes backlit by the northern lights. It is claimed to be the most photographed and painted mine headframe in the World!




NEW HOME




Loyal readers of the SOS will recall a short article in the November 2016 edition about O'Gorman High School's silver lining at the 2016 OFSAA Girls' A Provincial Basketball Championship. With many retuning players, this year's OHS team entered the 2017 Championship ranked first. They easily advanced to the Gold Medal Final, a home court rematch against defending OFSAA champions, ESC Jean-Vanier from Windsor. The Knights trailed for most of the first quarter before taking the lead en route to a decisive victory. Much like last year, Schumacher was well-represented on the OHS team: Brianna Hway and Gabriella Schaffner are lifelong Schumacher residents, and Jadyn Weltz is George & Karen Stefanic's grand-daughter. 
FATHERS WILL FLY AGAIN



After a 10 year hiatus, the Flying Fathers will return to the ice in 2018. Formed in 1963, the Flying Fathers were a team of Roman Catholic priests who toured Canada and beyond for 45 years raising funds for charity. They were founded by two northern Ontario priests, Father Brian McKee of Sault Ste. Marie and Schumacher's own Father Les Costello. Father Les, who won a Stanley Cup with the Toronto Maple Leafs before entering the priesthood, was considered the heart and soul of the original Flying Fathers. In fact, it was during a Flying Fathers game in Kincardine, ON that Father Les suffered a head injury that lead to his death in December, 2002. The Flying Fathers played more than 900 games and raised more than \$4 million for various charities before playing their last game in March 2008.

The "Holy Hockey Team" is being resurrected by Father John Perdue, the 32 year old Director of Vocations for the Diocese of Peterborough. Perdue grew up playing hockey and knew of the Flying Fathers. During his time at St. Augustine Seminary in Scarborough, Father John brought seminarians to Peterborough to play hockey against local youth. Interest in the games grew to the point where they created a tournament and named it in honour of our Schumacher Saint. The puck will drop on the 2018 Father Costello Classic on January 27th in Warsaw, Ontario. The tournament will feature teams from six Catholic high schools. The champions will face off against the newest incarnation of the Flying Fathers on January 29th at 5:30 PM in the Ennismore Arena in Peterborough, Ontario.


Frank Quinn, who moved from Timmins to Peterborough in 1978, was involved with the Flying Fathers organization for 40 years. He still holds the copyright to the Flying Fathers' name and has given Father John Perdue his blessing to resurrect the team. The new Flying Fathers will be comprised of 12 priests from the dioceses of Peterborough,





St. Catharines, Hamilton, Toronto, Kingston and Ottawa. While all the players will be new to the Flying Fathers, their goal is to bring back all the fun and family friendly antics associated with the original team.



Brian McTiernan, Bill Zubrinich, George Hicks, Denis Dufour, Tim Taylor, Rich Stefanich, Terry West, Zajac, Bijou Dave Buchar, Danny Buchar, Marcel Demers, Allan Cleverdon. Milan Vukelich and Dennis Morden. Players who contributed during the regular season included Richard Grikis and Don Saarela. The Bears, retained their title in 1971.
