



# WE'RE IN THIS TOGETHER



The Covid19 Pandemic is likely not news to you. Social distancing protocols, frequent hand washing practices and 14-day self-isolation procedures have become the new norm. Although the situation is rapidly changing both here in Canada and around the world, what follows is a brief overview of things the wider Timmins community is doing to get through these challenging times.

Musicians, including Schumacher's Paul Sebalj, (who is extremely talented), are hosting Facebook Live jam sessions. Over the course of several hours on Friday March 20th and 27th, Paul took song requests from his virtual audiences. He plans to host more Facebook shows in the weeks to come. Northern Windows & Doors, which operates out of the old St. Alphonsus Church building, is projecting a timely nightly reminder on the side of the bell tower. Across the city, residents are organizing Easter-themed window scavenger hunts as well as tributes to healthcare workers.

Local businesses are doing what they can to keep their doors open and provide necessary services to local residents. Restaurants across Ontario have been ordered to close their dining rooms, but takeout and delivery service are still permitted. Numerous local eateries, including Narduzzi's Restaurant, have chosen to keep their doors open while adhering to these new guidelines. Many local grocery stores and pharmacies have adopted the practice of reserving the first hour of business for seniors and those with special needs. Plexiglass dividers and distance markings are appearing in more and more shops.

Emergency service and healthcare staff continue to provide quality care on the front lines. Canada Post workers and delivery drivers continue to bring us our packages. With multiple cases of Covid19 confirmed in Timmins, their united plea is that we stay home to help flatten the curve.




# **HOCKEY NEWS**

## **FAREWELL TO AN ICON**

On St. Patrick's Day, March 17th, 2020, Daniel "Tixie" Hannigan passed away at the age of seventyseven years. He took pride in Schumacher and hockey was his passion. He expressed this through coaching, mentoring, and skate sharpening for well over forty-seven years. In the 1970s, Hannigan's Sports & Repair operated from what was formerly Domenic's Barbershop at 42 First Avenue / Father Costello Drive. Tixie moved the shop down the street to the old Sam Gurvitch Jewellers building in the 1980s. Then, for a time, Tixie worked out of his home on Goldmine Road. For the last number of years, he operated a small skate sharpening space at The Mac. Heartfelt condolences are extended to Tixie's wife, Sue, their children, Jay, Taurie, and Lee, and their families.

# HISTORY OF A PORTRAIT



There is an interesting story, and a whole lot of history, behind the large painting of Mr. F. W. Schumacher that hangs in the main hallway of Schumacher Public School. In the early 1930s, Mr. Percy Boyce, principal of Schumacher Public School, brought to Mr. Schumacher's attention that the school children desired a visual reminder of their community's namesake and generous benefactor. In response, Mr. Schumacher commissioned a painting of himself as a gift to the school.

As reported in the April 26, 1934 edition of The Porcupine Advance newspaper, the painting was formally presented to the school community by Mr. Schumacher during an evening event on Friday, April 20th, 1934. The evening featured musical entertainment by many local performers (including

a violin solo by SPS student Fred Delewski) as well as addresses by various dignitaries including School Board Chair W. C. Arnott, Inspector of Public Schools McVittie, and Principal Boyce.

When Mr. Schumacher addressed those gathered, he said of the painting, "It is the gift of a friend to his friends, the people and the children of Schumacher". In his remarks, he also commented that in the children rested the great hope of the nation and the world, the extension of culture, and the happiness of all. Reportedly Mr. Schumacher was pleased with the school facilities, the excellence of the teaching staff, and the capabilities of the 586 students (who represented no less than 20 different nationalities) enrolled at the school.

The oil on canvas painting of F. W. Schumacher was created by noted Canadian artist Kenneth Keith Forbes (1892-1980). According to the April 26, 1934 edition of The Porcupine Advance newspaper, Forbes' painting of F. W. Schumacher is not only valuable but also "assuredly a work of art, depicting Mr. Schumacher with fidelity and insight into character". Born in Toronto, Forbes enlisted with the British Army in 1914. In 1917, after twice being wounded and then rising to the rank of Lieutenant, Forbes was commissioned by Lord Beaverbrook (Max Aitken) to paint a series of official war pictures of the front. After the war, Forbes became a well-known portrait artist. His subjects included Canadian Prime Ministers Robert Borden, R. B. Bennett, and John F. Diefenbaker as well as many other public figures such as Winston Churchill and businessmen E. P. Taylor and Harry Oakes. Forbes was recognized with the Order of Canada in 1967 for his contributions to Canada as a "landscape and portrait painter". His works are held in major collections, including the National Gallery of Canada, the Canadian War Museum and the Art Gallery of Ontario. It is the sincere hope of the Schumacher Arts Culture & Heritage Association that the significance of the F. W. Schumacher painting continue to be shared with generations of Schumacher children.
