

# Diamond Hills Men's Association Minutes of Meeting May 9, 2019

The meeting was called to order by DHMA President Jim Varner at 7 PM.

#### **Minutes:**

Minutes of the April meeting were read and approved.

# Treasure's Report as of April 30, 2019:

General Fund Net: \$ 2369.50 (It was \$3,564.50 as of April 30, 2018) Classic Fund: \$ 995.00 (It was \$1,151.00 as of April 30, 2018) Hole in One Fund: \$ 535.00 (It was \$ 1325.00 as of April 30, 2018)

As of the end of April 2019 there were 115 men members and 8 women associate members. There were 149 men members and 13 women associate members at the end of April 2018.

The Treasurer's Report was approved.

## Meeting Between DHMA and DHGC on April 11. Topics for continued discussion:

- Summer green fees:
  - Began May 1<sup>st</sup>:
  - Weekdays \$28 plus tax. Weekends: \$32 plus tax.
  - Discounts for DHGC members are also in effect.
- Soil samples have been taken this month on the #14 and #16 fairways to determine the best plan to get them in shape. Sample analysis pending.
- There are plans to repair the water system for the #16 fairway.
- Continued work on greens: #11, #15, and the top area of #17.
- Sand traps. DHMA pointed out that sand trap repairs have been on the agenda for a while. DHGC responded that sand traps repairs are very expensive and not currently the highest priority. DHMA suggested trying a basic French Drain on one sand trap as a reasonably simple and inexpensive possible solution. (No further update on this item.)
- Bump and run shots. The areas in front of some greens need soil and sod so this shot becomes an option. Holes such as #11 and #17 could use some work in this regard. (No further update on this item.)
- Other organizations coming in for one day and getting a better rate that DHMA that puts 6,000 rounds on the course a year. We all know that organizations shop rates and that if a golf course can get new golfers on its course they may come back and bring their friends. DHMA suggested that if DHGC gives a \$30 Saturday rate to a tournament, that maybe it should identify some other Saturday where DHMA members get that same rate. DHGC has that under advisement. (No further update on this item.)

### **Old Business**

- DHMA was seeking a VP to replace Jim Varner, who was elected to President. Thanks to Tal Almand who has volunteered to step in, and has been elected as our new VP. Tal is relatively new to DHMA but has served as an officer in a number of volunteer organizations and he will be a good addition as a Board Member.
- During the February meeting it was noted that the By-Laws should be amended to indicate the duties and responsibilities of these three committees:
  - Handicap Committee
  - Rules Committee
  - Tournament Committee

The committees are working on this.

Rules Committee:

Chair: George Waller. Member: Eddie Sims. One other committee member desired.

A rules question was asked and answered since the April Meeting.

Q: What happens if the ball is moved accidentally on the tee or green?

A: No penalty; replace ball.

Tournament Committee:

Chair: New DHMA VP Tal Almand with members: Dan Gildea and Butch Matos. Nothing to report. Other committee members are needed.

#### **New Business:**

- Our Association, following PGA guidance, has voted on a 10-stoke limit per hole, but this has
  raised some questions that the Board has considered and is offering this as an amended way of
  addressing this issue:
  - In a net game count all your strokes and post every stroke, hole-by-hole, in GHIN. Let the computer handle the ESC.
  - In a points game such as Double Bogey Blitz, pick up after 10 and post a 10 in GHIN.
- DHGC is looking to remodel a part of the Pro Shop. This will include moving the DHMA desk and computer and wall mountings to the southeast corner of the room. A small dividing wall will define the area. (The box where we placed filled-in score cards is a mess. Will someone volunteer to build a better box, perhaps one with a slot?)
- The DHMA Schedule for December has been adjusted to move the monthly meeting to the 12<sup>th</sup> and the Christmas Tournament back to the 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Classic Points through April are available thanks to David Miranda. Reminder: The appeal time for posted Classic Points status and Player of the Year Points is 30 days after the posting. After 30 days the postings are final.
- There was discussion regarding when a ball on the green can be moved due to turf imperfections and when a ball can be moved on certain fairways due to lack of grass..
