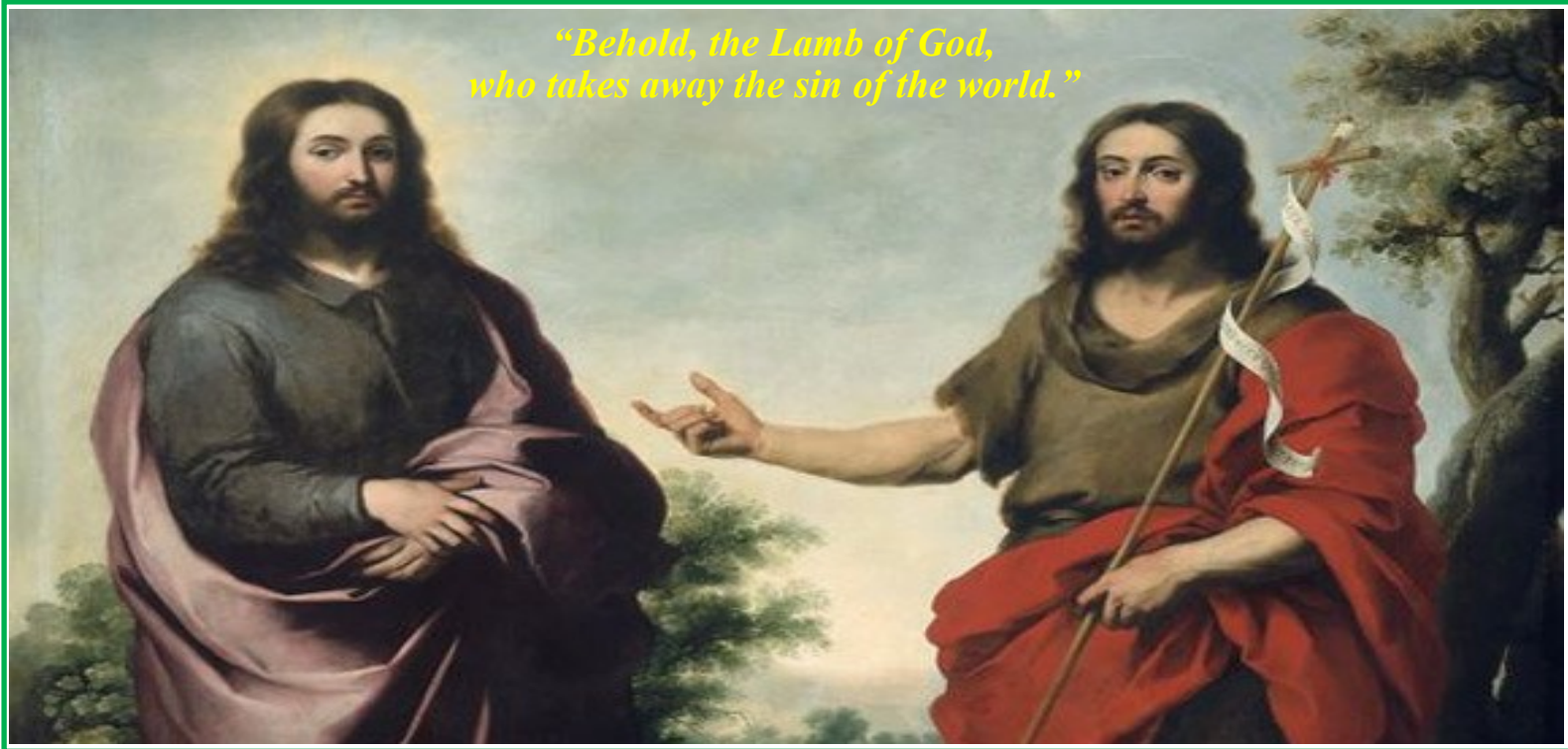

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Last weekend, we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and the end of the Christmas Season. As we noted last week, one of the reasons why Jesus came to be baptized by John, even though He was without sin, was to be in solidarity with us. Christ shares with us our need to grow closer to God and leads us to the Father who sent Him. Just as John the Baptist was preparing us for the Messiah's coming, he now takes a new step in pointing Jesus out to His first disciples. John tells them to, "**Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world.**" For Jesus is the one, the true lamb who will bring true salvation to the entire world.

You will no doubt recall how the Sacrificial Lamb was so important to Israel. It was the lamb that was sacrificed at the Temple of Jerusalem. Likewise, it was the Passover Lamb whose blood was painted over the doorposts that saved the firstborn of the Jews in Egypt, when the Angel of death, seeing the blood, passed over their homes. Thus, when we call Jesus the Lamb of God, we are acknowledging the great gift God has given us through the spilling of His blood on the Cross. Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross takes away our sins and leads us to the eternal life of Easter. He continues the saving action by giving us His Body and Blood. Keep in mind that the Eucharist is the Bloodless Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. This is why we pray before we receive Jesus, "*Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him who takes away the sins of the world, blessed are those who are called to the Supper of the Lamb...*"

As mentioned above, last Sunday was the last day of the Christmas Season, and this week we are beginning the Second Week of Ordinary Time. **What Ordinary Time does is orient us, "orders us" to our mission.** The Bishop of the Diocese (Bishop Barres) is called the Ordinary. This is not a reflection of his talents, holiness, or abilities, but the title serves as a description of his task: **to order the people of God for our common work.** Therefore, Ordinary Time helps us to organize our thoughts and intentions and common commitments toward the work Christ gives us. This is what we will be doing for the next few weeks, until we enter the Holy Season of Lent, followed by the Easter Triduum and then the 50 Days of Easter, and once again return to Ordinary Time until next Advent.

This month, we begin **Catholic Schools Week**, and during this week, we celebrate throughout the Church Community the great gift of Catholic Schools. We are

very blessed to have our own **Saint Edward's School**. Our school offers an excellent education in all ways of the world, but most importantly, it offers a wonderful education in the ways of the world to come. Your children or grandchildren will learn about their faith and God's plan for them. Please contact our **Principal, Ms. AnnMarie Lomanto**, to arrange a tour. In a few weeks from today, we will begin our kickoff for **the 2026 Catholic Ministries Appeal**. Care for Our Common Home

The foreign debt of poor countries has become a way of controlling them, yet this is not the case where ecological debt is concerned. The land of the southern poor is rich and mostly unpolluted, yet access to ownership of goods and resources for meeting vital needs is inhibited by a system of commercial relations and ownership which is structurally perverse. The poorest areas and countries are less capable of adopting new models for reducing environmental impact because they lack the wherewithal to develop the necessary processes and to cover their costs. We must continue to be aware that, regarding climate change, there are differentiated responsibilities. As the United States bishops have said, greater attention must be given to "the needs of the poor, the weak and the vulnerable, in a debate often dominated by more powerful interests". We need to strengthen the conviction that we are one single human family. There are no frontiers or barriers, political or social, behind which we can hide, still less is there room for the globalization of indifference.

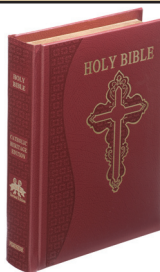
