

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today, from the Book of Numbers, we read, "With their patience worn out by the journey, the people complained against God and Moses...In punishment, the Lord sent among the people SARAPH Serpents, which bit the people so that many died. Then the people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned...pray the Lord to take the serpents from us!" So, Moses prayed... and the Lord said to Moses, "make a saraph and mount it on a pole, and if any who have been bitten look at it, they will live." "Moses...made a bronze serpent and mounted it on a pole, and whenever anyone who had been bitten by a serpent looked at the bronze serpent, he lived." The people, despite their complaining, were not abandoned by God in the desert, even though it appears that God was not a hundred percent happy with them. He sent the serpents upon the camp who inflicted damage and death, and one might think that this is the end. However, God tells Moses that by erecting the bronze serpent, they survived, and God once again set them free from slavery. Only this time, the enslaver was sin!

As we continue reading the Gospel, we see Jesus saying to Nicodemus, "...just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so everyone who believes in Him might not perish, but might have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved." The bronze serpent was an invitation to repent and then be healed, but this healing, while wonderful, by setting the people free from sin, would not prevent them from still physically dying. This would all change with Jesus.

Christ's lifted high on the Cross, so all can see, was following the example God gave Moses, but it was not stopping there. It was superseding Moses, for Jesus' lifting up meant His death, but it also meant our lives, as His death destroys spiritual death, sin, and darkness, and through His Resurrection, not only does He come back alive, so do we. Just like the people in the desert, they had to look up and embrace the bronze serpent; we must fully accept the salvation won for us by Christ.

As we were coming to the end of the past Easter Season, the Gospel readings were mostly from John. They spoke of two major themes: love and belief. We were called to Love as Jesus loves us, and to be instruments of love. We are also called to believe in the Gospel, especially that the Father sent Jesus to save us and have something more to depend on than the world and society's ideals.

We can only be instruments of Jesus' love by celebrating the Cross, for even now, when we look up at the Crucifix on the Church wall or at home, we are reminded of our salvation, and while it caused His death, Christ took it on so we can be saved. Today, unlike Good Friday, is not to be a sad day, but a day to celebrate and share in God's Glory, the Glory of Christ.

powerful prayers are gifts from Heaven, and we should believe in their great promises.


Adult Bible Study at St. Edward's



Registration Info for the 2025-2026 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education Program is an 8 year faith formation program for children attending public schools or non Catholic private schools. Religious Education Students are required to begin their religious studies in Grade 1 and complete their formal religious education classes in Grade 8.

Preparation for their reception of First Confession and First Holy Communion takes place in Grades 1 and 2. Students will receive

their First Confession in March of Grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of same year. Grades 3 - 6 are required continuation years for their studies. Confirmation studies occurs in Grades 7 and 8, with their Confirmation in the Fall of 9th Grade.

In Person Religion Classes will begin the week of September 28th.
