

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion?" Jesus uses a practical example. In fact, He uses several in today's Gospel to call us to a very spiritual reality: the reality of our Salvation! Jesus points out how we are all wise when it comes to deciding about the steps we take to get along in this life. If we are going to make a large purchase, we usually look at our financial situation, we look at all the options available, and we make the best choice. We also remember that if I buy one item, I may not be able to buy another item that we believe we need. Or perhaps if it comes to a career move or an educational opportunity for a loved one or ourselves, we might investigate the cost of time and money. Or, is it time to retire or leave the big house? We might try to look at all the angles and do our best to make the right decision.

Do we do this when it comes to our spiritual/faith lives, or do we say what can we do? We may say I will cross that bridge when I come to it. Of course, some may ask, how can I plan for this part of my life? Well, Jesus is telling us we need to plan, because if we wait to decide when we cross that bridge, we might discover that the bridge leads us to a place we do not want to go, and the bridge could be on fire! So how do we plan? It is not as hard as we think. Luke's Gospel gives us one way, and that is to renounce all our possessions. Renounce them and give them up if you can, but if you cannot give them up, then do not let them control your life. Do not be attached to them or the things of this world, for they are worthless and cannot be taken into the next life. Yes, we need things to exist in this world (food, clothing, housing, transportation, communication, even fun and entertainment), but many people have more than they need, and many try to get more, never thinking that they have enough.

Maybe wealth and possessions are not your problem. Maybe the problem is how we see others. Do we see Christ in our brothers and sisters, or are we too caught up looking for their shortcomings? Are we too quick to judge, or do we try to love as Jesus loves? Do we attend to our prayer life or are we caught up in the demands and details of this life, and we forget to thank the one who made this all possible? Do we allow God to be God and the focus of our lives? Or do we try to be God and call every shot, thinking we are in control? By asking these questions of ourselves, we are trying to take the right actions, if we find we do not

like the answers. So, if we find this, we must plan better, and the only way to do this is to turn to Christ. Now we know that there are times when we have turned to Christ and we still fail, do not worry, what this means is we have entered the struggle to try to do what is right. God truly understands and appreciates that we are trying our best, and with the help of the Holy Spirit, the intercession of the Blessed Mother and all of the saints, as well as the prayers of the whole community, we can bear our Cross and take the right bridge, the one that is not on fire!

Please keep in your prayers our young people who are preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this fall. Please keep them, their sponsors, and their families in your prayers so they can truly become good adult members of the Church.



Registration Info for the 2025-2026 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education Program is an 8 year faith formation program for children attending public schools or non Catholic private schools. Religious Education Students are required to begin their religious studies in Grade 1 and complete their formal religious education classes in Grade 8.

Preparation for their reception of First Confession and First Holy Communion takes place in Grades 1 and 2. Students will receive

their First Confession in March of Grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of same year. Grades 3 - 6 are required continuation years for their studies. Confirmation studies occurs in Grades 7 and 8, with their Confirmation in the Fall of 9th Grade.

In Person Religion Classes will begin the week of September 28th.

Canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis



Carlo Acutis (3 May 1991 – 12 October 2006) was a British-born Italian student celebrated for his devotion to the Eucharist and his use of digital media to promote Catholic devotion. Born in London and raised in Milan, he created a website documenting Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions. Diagnosed with leukemia, he died at age fifteen. Beatified by the Catholic Church in 2020, he is regarded as a model for young believers and is scheduled to be canonized as a saint on 7 September 2025. Acutis is often referred to as the "first millennial saint".

When Carlo was 12 years old, he became a <u>catechist</u> in his parish, Santa Maria Segreta. At the time, the Italian catechetical structure typically relied on young team leaders in youth groups, as contrasted with adults, to deliver religious education to their peers. Acutis's parish priest said of him that: Carlo was a young man who was exceptionally transparent. He really wanted to progress in loving his parents, God, his classmates, and those who loved him less. He wanted to apply himself in his studies to educate himself in his catechism class as well as in school and computer science.

Carlo showed an interest in the lives of saints, especially Francis of Assisi, Antony of Padua, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, Dominic Savio, Tarcisius, Bernadette Soubirous, and Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi. He is said to have prayed to his guardian angel frequently and exhibited a special devotion to St. Michael the Archangel.

People around Carlo considered him a "computer geek" due to his passion for and skill with computers and the internet. When he was 14, his parish priest asked him to create a webpage for his parish, Santa Maria Segreta in Milan. After this, a priest at his high school asked him to create a website to promote volunteering. For this work, he won a national competition called *Sarai volontario (Italian, "You will be a volunteer")*. Soon thereafter Carlo created a website dedicated to cataloguing each reported Eucharistic miracle in the world and maintaining a list of the approved Marian apparitions of the Catholic Church. Carlo launched the website in 2004 and worked on it for two and a half years. It was unveiled on 4 October 2006, the Feast of St. Francis, only days before his death. Because he was hospitalized, Carlo was not able to attend the debut of his exhibition at Rome's Church of San Carlo Borromeo.

In 2020 the Catholic Church recognized the curing of a child's pancreatic disease as a miracle attributed to Carlo's intercession. On 23 May 2024, Pope Francis recognized a second miracle attributed to the intercession of Carlo, when a woman suffering from a brain hemorrhage was cured from prayers asking for Carlo for help.

On 1 July 2024, Pope Francis presided at an ordinary consistory of cardinals, which approved the canonization of 15 people, including Carlo.

The life of Carlo Acutis has inspired multiple media adaptations, including a comic book, a video game, a documentary film, and an animated film. Carlo is an inspiration to all, especially for young people. In his own words to his mother, "...don't be afraid. Since Jesus became a man, death has become the passage towards life, and we don't need to flee it. Let us prepare ourselves to experience something extraordinary in the eternal life".

Canonization of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati



Pier Giorgio Frassati, (6 April 1901 – 4 July 1925) was an Italian Catholic activist and a member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic. He was dedicated to social justice issues and joined several charitable organizations, including Catholic Action and the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, to better aid the poor and less fortunate living in his hometown of Turin; he put his own pious beliefs into practice to cater to their needs and was best known for his devotion and amiable character.

Frassati was an avid mountaineer who often climbed with his friends; he was an able swimmer and athlete best known for engaging in such social activities with a range of like-minded friends. His charitable outreach towards others knew no bounds for he identified with and aided the poor and ill from his childhood. His social status granted him greater freedom in aiding others who needed it most. Frassati was known as the "Terror" due to his fondness for practical jokes, though they were in good taste.


He was an average student in school, though Frassati was known among his peers for his intelligence and more so for his devotion. He failed his exams in 1913 and so was sent for private studies at a school run by the Jesuits.

Frassati was dedicated to works of social action that would unite people together in fellowship as a means of combating inequalities. He was an opponent of fascism and did not support the regime of Benito Mussolini. He was once arrested in Rome while protesting alongside the 1921 Young Catholic Workers Congress. He was involved with student groups as well as the Apostolato di preghiera and Catholic Action which he dedicated himself.

Frassati also became a professed member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic on 28 May 1922 to imitate the example of Dominic of Osma, assuming the religious name of "Girolamo" in honour of Girolamo Savonarola. He was also devoted to the teachings of Thomas Aquinas and Catherine of Siena. The teachings of Paul the Apostle also inspired him and that saint is mentioned in a range of Frassati's letters. He often said: "Charity is not enough; we need social reform". He helped establish a newspaper entitled Momento whose principles were based on Pope Leo XIII's Rerum novarum. He joined a Saint Vincent de Paul conference in 1918 and spent much of his time helping the poor and less fortunate.

Two miracles were attributed to him, and in 1989 John Paul II visited his tomb and paid honor to him calling him the "Man of the Eight Beatitudes". Pope Benedict XVI called upon adolescents in 2010 to follow the example of Frassati to "... discover that it is worth to commit oneself for God ... to respond to His call in the fundamental decisions" throughout one's life".


Pope Leo XIV announced that Frassati would be canonized on 7 September 2025, more than a century after his death, along with Blessed Carlo Acutis, whose canonization had been similarly postponed.


