From Fr. Mike's Desk

There is a prayer in the Church that has been said from the beginning. It is short and simple, but it says so much. In fact, this prayer is very appropriate for what we hear in today's Gospel. The prayer goes like this; "Lord I believe but help me in my unbelief." In fact, it was also very appropriate for last week's Gospel from Luke. As you may recall, the Apostles did not believe the women who went to the tomb and found it empty. They did not believe that the angels spoke to them, however, Peter listened to the story, got up, and ran to the tomb. He did not find Jesus' body but did find the burial cloths in a place all their own. He was amazed, and he began to believe. As we saw last week, Peter began His journey back to being the Rock on whom Jesus will build His Church.

Now we come to this week's Gospel from John. We read this Gospel every Second Sunday of Easter, and in it we see that the Risen Lord appears to the Apostles in the locked Upper Room. When He appears, He says, "Peace be with you!" The disciples are overjoyed, and as Deacon Jim points out, Jesus did not condemn them for running away, and He did not yell at Peter for denying Him three times. However, as we will soon see, Christ will deal with that event separately. He greets them with Peace, Blessings, Love, and tells them to receive the Holy Spirit. Today's passage also tells us that Thomas was missing, and we do not know why. We can guess or suppose, but the fact is, he was not there. When Thomas returns, the others tell him that they had seen the Lord, but he refused to believe them. Why? I imagine that he wanted to believe but could not accept it until he saw for himself. He wanted to believe, but it was just too good to be true, so to avoid disappointment, he chose not to believe. The prayer applies right here, Lord, I believe, but help me in my unbelief. How could you rise from the dead?

A week passes, and Jesus appears again to them (on the 2nd Sunday), and this time Thomas is present. Jesus once again greets them with Peace, and then He questions Thomas and his disbelief. Thomas has no answer, instead, he falls to his knees and makes the most profound statement of faith ever seen in both Testaments, "My Lord and My God!" He perceives Jesus not only as his Lord, but now he can clearly see that Jesus is God! As Jesus continues, He tells Thomas that he believed because he saw, but blessed are those who believe without seeing. Blessed are they who believe because they look through the eyes of

faith, blessed are we because we see with the same eyes. Lord, I believe, but help me in my unbelief, help me when my faith is weak, or when life gets too hard to bear. Help me when I build walls between you and me, and always help me to trust in you.

In a unique way, the following words can also help us in our unbelief. The words that Jesus commanded to be placed on the Icon of the Divine Mercy, whose feast Day we also celebrate on this Second Sunday of Easter. The words are, "Jesus, I trust in you." Jesus' love and mercy were always with the Apostles 2,025 years ago, and His love and mercy are here for us today and for those who will follow us. Never lose sight of this and never forget it!

By our Baptism we have clothed ourselves in Christ, and He calls each of us to follow Him. How often do we succeed in following His call?



Bishop Barres' Statement on the Death of Pope Francis

April 21, 2025

As we mourn the death of Pope Francis on this Easter Octave Monday and the gift of his contemplative global evangelization grounded in Matthew 25 and the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, we give thanks to Father, Son and Holy Spirit for his unique graces and charisms and the compelling way during his Pontificate that he has been a Light of Jesus Christ and the mission of mercy of the Catholic Church to the world.

In Evangelii Gaudium (2013), Pope Francis speaks about the original freshness of the Gospel: "Jesus can also break through the dull categories with which we would enclose him and he constantly amazes us by his divine creativity. Whenever we make the effort to return to the source and to recover the original freshness of the Gospel, new avenues arise, new paths of creativity open up, with different forms of expression, more eloquent signs and words with new meaning for today's world. Every form of authentic evangelization is always 'new." (11)

Pope Francis' commitment to the freshness of the Gospel and his desire to forge new paths of mission creativity were expressed in his encyclicals Lumen Fidei (2013), Laudato si' (2015), Fratelli Tutti (2020), and Dilexit Nos (2024), along with his apostolic exhortations Evangelii Gaudium (2013), Amoris Laetitia (2016) and Gaudete et Exsultate (2018), Christus Vivit (2019), Querida Amazonia (2020), Laudate Deum (2023), and C'est la confiance (2023).

This section of Evangelii Gaudium captures, I believe, Pope Francis' passionate love for the Church and the world and it will continue to inspire us as the Holy Spirit leads us further into the 21st century: "How I long to find the right words to stir up enthusiasm for a new chapter of evangelization full of fervor, joy, generosity, courage, boundless love and attraction! Yet I realize that no words of encouragement will be enough unless the fire of the Holy Spirit burns in our hearts. A spirit-filled evangelization is one guided by the Holy Spirit, for he is the soul of the Church called to proclaim the Gospel...I once more invoke the Holy Spirit. I implore him to come and renew the Church, to stir and impel her to go forth boldly to evangelize all peoples." (261)

Today, we pray for the soul of Pope Francis, we pray for the College of Cardinals which will elect his successor, and we pray for his successor who will be elevated to the Chair of Saint Peter.

As we pray for the soul of our Holy Father Pope Francis on this Easter Octave Monday, we remember his words on our Lord's Resurrection.

In The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis writes: "Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated the world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force...Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history...Such is the power of the resurrection, and all who evangelize are instruments of that power." (276)

May the Word of God be a Light and a Lamp for our steps and may the Holy Spirit lead and guide us!


