From Fr. Mike's Desk

"When the captain and the court officials had brought the apostles in and made them stand before the Sanhedrin, the high priest questioned them, 'We gave you strict orders, did we not, to stop teaching in that name?' 'Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching...' But Peter and the apostles replied, 'We must obey God rather than men.' The Sanhedrin ordered the apostles to stop speaking in the name of Jesus and dismissed them. So, they left...rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name."

As we continue to celebrate Easter, our reading from the Acts of the Apostles gives us the account of what became a wonderful moment for the early Church. For they were brought before the Sanhedrin and ordered to stop speaking about Jesus. The members of the Holy Court certainly believed that this would be enough to silence the Apostles, but as we can see, it was not! The Apostles left happy, and this would be the case every time they came before the authorities, even when they were jailed. This also would be true when they went out from the Holy Land to go to all the ends of the earth, where they would all face death (except for St. John). But please keep in mind that this was not always the case with the Apostles, as we see in today's reading from John's Gospel.

"Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'we also will come with you." So, what, they went fishing, what is so wrong or unusual about that? They were of the mind that a bad day of fishing is better than a good day at work. Or they just liked to fish. Keep in mind that with John's Gospel, there is always more than what meets the eye. Recall that Peter, Andrew, James, and John were professional fishers, and as we see in Luke's Gospel, Peter followed Jesus after a large catch some three or four years earlier. Fishing was not a day off activity for them; it was a way of life, and some scholars believe that Peter (even after seeing the Risen Lord) was going to give up the whole mission and go back to his former way of life. Some scholars also believe he was trying to give it up because of the guilt he felt for denying Jesus three times on Holy Thursday Night. Whatever the reason, Peter and the others are saying that the past three years have been something we will never forget, but now it is time to go back to our normal lives.

Christ, the Lord, would not allow them to go backwards; no they were to constantly move forward, as

we see in each question that Jesus puts before Peter. These three questions were asked to counterbalance the three times that Peter denied Christ outside the High Priest's house. With each question, Jesus gives Peter a command: Feed my lambs, Tend my sheep, Feed my sheep. Finally, after the whole discourse, the Risen Lord gives Peter one more command, Follow Me! Obviously, something happened between this encounter at the Sea of Galilee and the events in the Acts of the Apostles, and that something is the Coming of The Holy Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit that gave the Apostles the strength to confront the very same people they feared in the Garden of Gethsemane. It is this same Holy Spirit that would keep the Apostles from going backwards, and it is this same Holy Spirit that keeps us 2,025 years later ever moving forward.
