

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Last week we read about the great miracle of the Loaves and Fishes, and we read about a similar miracle carried out by the Prophet Elisha, who fed 100 people with a small amount of food. This week the people who were fed came looking for Jesus so they could eat some more. They, of course, did not recognize the significance of Jesus' action nor that of Elisha's.

We see this theme of great hunger and satisfaction in today's reading from the Book of Exodus. The people on their trek across the desert were extremely hungry and they were grumbling against Moses, Aaron and even God because of their condition. God for His part heard their cries and told Moses that He will rain down bread from Heaven. God told Moses that each day the people should go out and gather their daily portion, no more and no less, and on the day before the Sabbath, they should gather enough for two days. God also sent quail upon the camp so they could have their fill. It appeared that God always responded to His people, even when they complained and forgot what He did for them. As Saint Paul tells us, God is always faithful to us, because that is who He is.

Jesus shows us this same quality when the people come to Him looking for more food. He did not deny their request, but He also did not give them what they wanted or expected. What Jesus did was try to get them to see the true crux of the He told them that they should stop miracle. working for the food that perishes and that they should be looking for the food that endures, the food which gives Eternal Life. However, His answer was not enough for them and they, like the people of the Exodus, started challenging Him. They said, "What sign can You do that we may see and believe in You? What can You do?" [After all] "Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written; 'He gave them bread from heaven.'" Jesus reminded them, that Moses did not give them the bread; it was God the Father, who even now, was giving them the true bread, which comes down from heaven! They were curious, so they asked Jesus to give them this bread always. In true Divine Fashion, Jesus told them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to Me will never hunger and whoever believes in Me will never thirst." As we will continue next week, they will not like this answer and many will walk away from Jesus, as they grumbled just like their ancestors.

Now the challenge presented to us, is can we get past our grumbling when things do not seem to go the way we would like them? Do we think of the needs of others or only of ourselves? Are we willing to give back to God or do we just take? Keep in mind that Christ is giving His all to us in the Blessed Sacrament, and He does this so we may have life and so we can be one with Him and each other.

Remember next weekend is our Annual Parish Festival which we will hold at the Syosset Train Station on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. It promises to be a great weekend, with Fireworks, Food, Games, Classic Cars, Great Music and so much more. A special thanks to the Town of Oyster Bay for always allowing us to use the train station and to our neighbors for being patient with us as we celebrate St. Edward's, Syosset and the surrounding areas. See you there!

Let us pray, Lord Jesus Christ, we worship you living among us in the Sacrament of your Body and Blood. May we offer to our Father in heaven a solemn pledge of undivided love. May we offer to our brothers and sisters a life poured out in living service of that Kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.





SATURDAY, AUGUST 11 (4PM - 11 PM) IS OLDIES NIGHT featuring the Long Island band The History of Rock and Roll.






