


From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world." These words from the Letter of Saint James, gives us the theme of today's readings. How do we practice our religion? Sometimes religion gets a bad rap, because some feel it places a barrier between different groups of people or even between a person and God. After all why do I have to follow a bunch of rules, can't I just talk to God? Why should I follow any religion, after all the leaders are just out for power and they keep all of the money they collect? While this certainly can be true in some cases, especially in those who establish a cult following, this is not the case with True Religion. As Saint James tells his listeners, and Jesus reaffirms in today's Gospel passage. They both reaffirm that yes, we should be able to freely speak to God, (and we should every day in fact many times during the day), and we can talk to God without coming into the Church. However, this does not negate the value of or the need for religion and its practices, especially when we are speaking about the Church.

Remember the Church is the Living Body of Christ; it is all who are baptized with water in the Name of the Father, and of The Son, and of The Holy Spirit. While the institution and offices are also a part of the Church, they are just a part (a necessary part that acts in the person of Christ who is Priest, Prophet and King) and not the whole. The Church is the Dwelling Place of the Holy Spirit; therefore, God Himself guides, teaches, and directs the Church along her way. That is why Dogmas, Teachings, Precepts, and Canons of the Church can be trusted since they are based on our Hebrew Traditions (the Law of Moses and the teachings of the Prophets and the Wisdom Books), and the Revelations and Teachings of Our Lord Jesus Christ, given to us continually by the working and grace of the Holy Spirit. The Church does not exist for her own sake, no, she exists to do the will of her groom and founder Jesus. The Church serves as the instrument of the Kingdom of God, calling all to the Father and Eternal Life.

With this being said, about True Religion, we must keep in mind that there have been people and

there are people who are not practicing pure, undefiled religion. That is why St. James writes what he does and why Jesus is lashing out against the Pharisees. The Pharisees took care to make sure to purify every cup, jug, kettle, and bed. Not that this is a bad thing to do, but they forgot why they were doing it. What became more important for them was merely carrying out the purifications, the rituals, and even the prayers without putting their hearts into what they were doing. In reality, Our Lord was telling them that they were just practicing their faith for all to see, but they had forgotten to know, love and serve the Lord or one another. St. James tells us how we can avoid this mistake, and that is to put our faith into action. We must carry out the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy and follow the Precepts of the Church, and we must carry them out from our hearts. These are important to know, because they show us how we can make our practice of our faith true.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are: Feed the Hungry, Give Drink to the Thirsty, Clothe the Naked, Shelter the Homeless, Visit the Sick, Visit the Imprisoned, Bury the Dead.

The Spiritual works of Mercy are: Instruct the Ignorant, Counsel the Doubtful, Correct the Sinner, Bear Wrongs done to you Patiently, Forgive Offenses Willingly, Comfort the Sorrowful, Pray for the Living and the Dead.

The Precepts of the Church are: Go to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, Go to Confession at Least Once a Year (traditionally during the Season of Lent), Receive the Eucharist at Least once a Year, during the Easter Season (this is known as Easter Duty), To Observe the Days of Fasting and Abstinence, To Help Provide for the Needs of the Church according to One's Abilities And Station In Life, To Obey the Marriage laws of the Church, To Participate in the Church's Mission to Evangelize.




Religious Education Registration Info for the 2018-2019 School Year

<u>Families who are new to the Religious Education Program</u> may print out a New Family Registration Form from our web site at www.saintedwardre.com. Click on <u>Forms to Print</u>. It is a two-page form, so please be sure to print both pages. You may also choose to register online by selecting the link: <u>On-Line Registration for NEW Families</u>. We do ask, however, that all new families kindly contact the office by either calling 921-8543 or by emailing the Director at rpettei@st-edwards.org to arrange an appointment to meet with her. Mrs. Pettei will fill you in about the program here at St. Edward's.

St. Edward Religious Education is an 8-year formation program. Public School Students start in grade 1 and finish classes in grade 8. Our Kindergarten session is optional. Preparation for First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students receive their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2.

Grades 3 through 6 are continuation years in students' religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation takes place in grades 7 and 8. Students receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.






