

From Fr. Mike's Desk

As we look at our Old Testament reading from the Book of Wisdom, and today's reading from Mark, we can see why the Liturgists of the Church put these two readings together. Remember, except for the Easter Season, the first reading and the gospel have some form of connection. Of course, during the Easter Season the first reading comes from the Acts of the Apostles. This week we can see the connection, as Wisdom gives us a prophetic Old Testament account of what will happen to the Messiah. This can be perceived especially when we read, "Let us beset the just one...he set himself against our doings." "For if the just one be the son of God, God will defend him, and deliver him from the hands of his foes... Let us condemn him to a shameful death; for according to his own words, God will take care of him." Now compare this to what Jesus tells the Apostles, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him."

Without a doubt they work together, however, the human author of Wisdom did not intend this to be a prophecy about the Messiah, as he wrote this passage to tell us about human nature and weakness. Look at the many Saints throughout the Church's history, the Prophets of Old, and any great person in the world's history that worked for the good of others. So many times people have gone against these good people or tried to find any flaw they could. So many times people have tried to take them down or test them, and Wisdom's author is asking why? Why do we not rally behind these good people? Why do we not immediately follow their good example? Perhaps the answer is fear of being hurt by that person, or we have learned not to be too trusting. We have seen too many con men throughout history who at first looked so good but turned out to be so bad and had to be destroyed. People like Caesar, Napoleon, Mussolini, Hitler, and I am sure you can add a few more names. So while we should be careful at the beginning, why is it that after the person has proven him or herself, so many still go against that person? Maybe this reaction comes from jealousy, or the fear that we can never hope to be as good as that person so we look for shortcomings and flaws. So we will not feel bad or so we have an excuse to turn away. After all, it is very hard for us to see where we fall short in our own lives. Therefore, Wisdom is urging us to avoid this behavior. Once we know that person is truly good and truly from God, we should do our best to follow that person.

If only the teachers and the leaders during Jesus' Public Ministry had understood Wisdom's lesson, perhaps their response to Jesus would have been different. Even the Apostles did not understand the lesson when they argued amongst themselves who was greater. While they truly saw the goodness of Jesus, they still could not totally see it in each other as they fought for Our Lord's approval. They allowed their fears and shortcomings to get the best of them, as they thought they were going to be left behind. Nevertheless, this is not what it means to be a follower of Christ. If we have truly accepted Christ we must work for the good of all and we must all do it together. This is why Jesus places the child in their midst and tells them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in mv name. receives me; and the one who sent me." Why does Jesus choose a child? In Jesus' day, a child was considered the property of his or her father and the child owned nothing and had no power to control So if Christ's disciples act as his own life. innocently and as powerless as a little child, they will in fact gain everything. They will not gain anything of earthly power and riches, no, they will gain everything that comes down from God and leads to Eternal Life in Heaven. Let us learn Wisdom's Lesson and let us freely, without fear follow Christ.




Prayer to St. Michael

The 100th Anniversary of St. Padre Pio Receiving the Stigmata of Jesus Christ and the Wounds of the Church in our Day

On Thursday, September 20, 2018 we will celebrate the 100th Anniversary of St. Padre-Pio (1887-1968) receiving the stigmata of Jesus Christ.

The stigmant are the wounds of Christ - in his hands, in his feet and in his side — which he experienced in his passion, cruciffxion and death. Certain saints in the history of the Church have been given the gift of the stigmate as a special sign of their union with the Crucified Christ.

As a Capachin Friar, SI. Pio was a son of St. Francis of Assist (1)81/(182-1226) who also received and fived his life with the stigmata. St. Pio's stigmata showed how he fived the Passion and Crucifixion of Christ in a mystical way.

His wounds helped him to understand the cosmic power of the Catholic Mass, the unbloody renewal of Christ's sacrifice on Calvary and the relationship between a hotyliving of the priesthood and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

His wounds helped him to be a Doctor of Mercy in the confessional and a Doctor of Mercy for those who had experienced all types of trauma in life. St. Pio's wounds gave him a unique understanding of how to heal the wounds of the Church throughout history.

During these painful and traumatic moments for our Church, we ask St. Padre Pio's intercession to help heal the wounds of the Church in our time.

FATHER, SON AND HOLY SPIRIT, WE THANK YOU FOR THE HOLY WITNESS OF YOUR PRIEST, SAINT PADRE PIO, AND THE GIFT OF THE STIGMATA THAT YOU GAVE HIM.


