From Fr. Mike's Desk

A little less than a month ago, we celebrated Labor Day, and on this day, we honor all of those who work so hard for the good of our country and the world. This consists of all types of labor and professions, and we know that all types of honest labor are blessed by God, especially as remembered by our dear Saint Joseph under the title of St. Joseph the Worker (May 1st). Today's readings give us a view of the labors of a Christian; the labor every follower of Christ must do to build the Kingdom of God, and to change the image of the world to conform to the Gospel. While it is true that all good labor contributes to the building up of the Kingdom, it is also true that we are to labor beyond our occupations and professions to preach and live out the Good News. In fact, to strengthen us in our Spiritual Labor, the Church provides us with two sacraments of Vocations: one being Marriage and the other Holy Orders. These are also aided by those who have taken Solemn Vows to the Consecrated or Religious Life, and for those who, as single Christians, dedicate their lives to the Gospel. All of these: Sacraments, Vows, and Dedications help Church members increase their faith, and help us all to live out our Baptismal Call. But service to the Church is not always easy and sometimes it is downright frustrating, so much so that we even ask why are we doing this?

The Prophet Habakkuk asks God this very question, and seems to be saying to God, 'Why do you allow the things that defeat us to happen?' But God answers him with a vision in which He tells Habakkuk to write it down, so that all may read it. And then do not be impatient, rather be people of faith. In time, we will see God's plan emerge. Paul tells us that we were not given a spirit of cowardice, but rather the power and love of self-control. Paul tells us not to be ashamed or lose heart, but to bear our share of hardships for the Gospel and to do it with the strength that comes from God.

Finally, Jesus' response to the Apostles' request to increase their faith reflects what our call to Christian Labor is all about. Jesus tells them that if they had faith the size of a mustard seed, that would be enough for them to do anything. Then, Our Lord goes into the example of a master and his slave. How the slave must do his master's bidding before he can take care of himself. That is the natural way, and Jesus is implying that is the way it should be with us in our service to God, the Church, and the World. We as disciples are called to work, and when we have come to the end of the day, we are not looking for a reward, but say we are

just unprofitable servants doing just what we are supposed to do. While this may seem contrary to common thought and certainly seems un-American, it is truly the Christian Way. We should gladly do what is required of us and do it out of love and with gladness. The gift that will help us to do this is Faith (as we saw in the Letter to the Hebrews, from August 7th). This is part of what Jesus means when He tells us that if we have faith the size of a mustard seed, it is enough because if we put our faith into practice, the easier it is to serve the Lord with gladness, and the more our faith will grow from the size of a mustard seed to being the whole bush.

We close with a Prayer to Strengthen Faith, Hope and Love.

Almighty and ever-living God, strengthen our faith, hope, and love. May we do with loving hearts what you ask of us and come to share the life you promise. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,

God forever. Amen




