From Fr. Mike's Desk

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles. Last week, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, which usually leads us back to the Sundays of Ordinary Time. Today would have been the 13th Sunday of Ordinary Time, but this year it has changed because this feast day is too great to be overlooked. Also, we must not forget that Saints Peter and Paul are the patron saints of the Diocese of Rome, of which the Pope is the bishop. Both Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome; Peter first around 64 AD under the control of Nero, and Paul was martyred around 67 AD. Now, even though they were a few years apart, they were still close enough to be considered martyred at the same time. Despite what the Romans thought, their deaths did not weaken the Church in Rome; in fact, it made the faith and the community stronger and not ready to give in. The people learned not to lose hope, and they realized that Christ was with them in all times and situations.

One of the points of interest about this feast day is the great churches that were built over the resting places of these Apostles. As you may know, St. Peter was crucified upside down, on Vatican Hill, and was buried in a cemetery on the same hill. This resulted in the building of a great church over that cemetery and hill, which lasted until the late Middle Ages/Renaissance period. But this could only happen after the Emperor Constantine declared that Christianity was a legal religion in the Empire, which led to Christianity being the only religion allowed in the empire. Saint Paul's remains were placed in a tomb that was located outside of the ancient walls of the city, and they built a large church over the remains and became known as St. Paul's Outside the Walls. This original church suffered a great fire and was rebuilt with a larger church.

The churches remind us of the words from today's Gospel, "You are Peter the Rock and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." After

two thousand years, we are still here and will be here until Christ comes again. Remember the Church is the Living Body of Christ, and the dwelling place of The Holy Spirit, and that means God will always guide her and the forces of evil will never win, because you cannot defeat The Holy Spirit.

On this day, remember these two great saints, we must continue to pray for Pope Leo XIV, who assumed the Chair of St. Peter to be the Bishop of Rome and Pope of the whole Church. Pray that he may always do well and love, and care for the Church.

Saints Peter and Paul - Pillars of the Church


