From Fr. Mike's Desk

"'Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you.' Jesus said, 'What do you want me to do for you?' The blind man replied to him, 'Master I want to see.' Jesus told him, 'Go your way; your faith has saved you.' Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way."

Today we are given a great lesson in faith and the power of prayer. The Prophet Jeremiah tells the people that they should have faith in God for He will console and guide them even they who have suffered. God will never forget Israel, who is His firstborn. Yes, God allowed them to fall, because they abandoned His will, yet God would not allow their disobedience to be the last word in their relationship with Him. God went out of His way to restore them, first by sending the King of Persia who restored them to Jerusalem, and then He will send His only begotten Son who will indeed be the last Word in their relationship with God. Have great faith in God, for He will not let us go or abandon us, and as it was during the time of Jeremiah, so it is for us now.

We have a great justification in our faith as we read the account of Bartimaeus and realize that his prayers were answered. When he hears that Jesus is coming, he knows what Jesus can do, so he calls out to Jesus with deep faith and confidence. Bartimaeus cries more and louder when they tell him to be guiet, which of course gets Jesus' attention. When Jesus calls him over, the crowd changes how they act. They bring Bartimaeus quickly over to Jesus and they tell him what is quoted above, to take courage. This statement is important for us as well, for we should always take courage when we are approaching God the Father with our prayers, take courage for the Father has sent His Son so we can be in a relationship with Him, and They both send the Holy Spirit so we will always receive the Grace we need to increase our faith. Christ shows the Father's love for us constantly by what He does for our sake in His death and resurrection, in His giving of Himself to us in the Eucharist, and in His answering our prayers; just as He answered the prayers of Bartimaeus, Jairus with his daughter, the Centurion's servant, and so many examples that we see throughout the New Testament. We also see this in the lives of the Saints throughout the 2024 years of the Church's history. Whenever you have any doubts remember today's Gospel and Jeremiah's words of consolation, they can truly inspire all of us!

We will celebrate the **Feast of All Saints** this coming **Thursday Night and Friday, November 1**st. This is a holy day of obligation and to observe it we will celebrate Mass on Thursday Night at **5 PM**, Friday Morning at **9 AM**, Friday also at **12:10 PM**, and **7:00 PM** Friday Night. Remember that on **Sunday, November 3rd at 3:00 PM** we will celebrate a *Mass of Remembrance* for all those who have died in the past year.

Also please keep in your prayers our young people who will receive Confirmation in November. *Bishop John O. Barres, the Bishop of Rockville Centre* will celebrate the Mass and Sacrament.

Next Week's Gospel Question

In Mark's Gospel Jesus answered a question asked by a scribe. Having answered the scribe, and upon hearing the scribe's reply, Jesus knew that the scribe had understood His teaching. Jesus went on to say to the scribe "You are not far from the kingdom of God."

In reading next week's gospel, can you claim to fully comprehend the meaning of Jesus' answer to the scribe? What is your understanding of 'the kingdom of God'? A Letter from Father Mike.

My Dear Parish Family,

A few weeks ago, I reported to you what many of you read in the paper that the Bankruptcy Process, initiated by the Diocese of Rockville Centre, was coming close to completion. However, we will not totally know this until early December when the final opinions are heard.

The Diocese applied for the Chapter 11 process in October of 2020, as a result of the passage of the New York State Child Victims' Act. This legislation allowed lawsuits for historical accusations of child sexual abuse regardless of how many years or decades have passed. The number of lawsuits that were brought against the Diocese, parishes, schools, and other ministries made it impossible to fairly compensate the victims, the people who still suffer these abuses. If each case went to trial, the result would have meant that the first survivor in line with claims would receive compensation that would leave extraordinarily little or nothing for those who followed.

The Bankruptcy Process offered the possibility of equitable compensation for the victims and hopefully would provide some healing. Likewise, the process would allow the Church to continue its saving mission of Christ, by securing the future of our parishes. To this end, it was decided by all involved in the process that the Diocese, as well as the parishes and other ministries, would contribute to the victim's fund/settlement. This would allow for the desired effects of compensation and for allowing the Church to continue serving the people of Long Island. The parishes were also directed to contribute to ensure that no future historical claims submitted later would put the parishes at risk.

Saint Edward's contribution, which was realized by our reserves and investments, is \$207,468. While this is a high number, some parishes will be offering more, and some will be giving less. We must also realize that some parishes will not be able to contribute at all, that is how bad their finances are. We must likewise help them as we are all in this together. As I shared with you, while the number is high, and it will hurt us a little, this amount will not kill us, because we have been and will continue to work on investing where and when we can. I realize that some of us might feel anger and confusion over this and wonder why we must give anything! There are several reasons. Again, we must participate in the process, or we will not have protection facing future historical accusations. But the most important and best answer is we are the Church, and while we can be angry at how this was handled in the past and the mistakes that people made, we are still a family, and family helps each other in times of trouble. The survivors of abuse are still hurting, and no settlement is going to make the pain go away. They are family too and need all the help we can give them. We must remember they deserve our love, respect, and prayers. Keep in mind that this is an extremely painful time for them, their families, and for all of us. We pray that this will allow for some healing.

The Church has enacted strict Child Protection Protocols to ensure that the Church is one of the safest places for everyone. Our record through the last two decades has proven these methods work and truly do their best to protect God's Children. Thank you for your kind consideration, your prayers, and your compassion. Let us continue to pray for the Church to keep working hard to make sure we never have to deal with this again.

Did You Know...?

The Amazing Life of Padre Pio -

On September 23, we celebrated the feast day of St. Padre Pio who was born Francesco Forgione in southern Italy on May 25, 1887 to parents who were peasant farmers. At the age of five, he told his family he wanted to dedicate his life to serving God. As a child, Francesco was very ill. Despite his poor health, he studied diligently and was accepted into the novitiate of the Capuchin friars where he took the name "Pio" in honor of Pope Pius I. He became a priest in 1910. Throughout his life Padre Pio had heavenly visions – not only his guardian angel, but of Jesus and the Virgin Mary. He often advised his followers to remember their guardian angels. In time, Padre Pio became known worldwide for his piety and charity. For a majority of Padre Pio's life, he experienced the stigmata, the nail wounds of Christ, a phenomenon that attracted much interest and controversy. At first the Vatican became concerned about the attention but after investigation, the Church concluded his condition was not fake and allowed Padre Pio to preach publicly. Over the years, Padre Pio wrote thousands of letters giving spiritual wisdom. He also suffered many illnesses and inspired others to turn to develop a deeper relationship with God through their suffering. He would go on to open a world-class hospital to serve the poor. Padre Pio died on September 23, 1968 at the age of 81. His funeral was attended by over 100,000 people. In 2002 he was canonized by Pope John Paul II. St. Pio's shrine draws over 8 million visitors each year.

Padre Pio's message to the many that came to him seeking help was "Pray, hope and don't worry."...a message as important today as it was then and as it carries into the future.




