From Fr. Mike's Desk

Prayer is a form of religious practice that seeks a connection to some greater power. Prayer may be individual or communal, and it may invoke the use of words or song. Most major religions invoke prayer in one way or another. Prayer can be words of supplication, thanksgiving, worship, and praise, and prayer can be used to seek guidance or assistance or to ask for forgiveness. Prayer can be for oneself or offered for others. This is how we define prayer, but these words of definition seem to forget that prayer is a conversation and a bridge builder between our loving Father and us.

We see prayer as the subject in today's Gospel when the disciples asked Jesus how to teach them to pray. As Luke tells us, they made this request after they saw Him praying to the Father. The words Jesus gave them are the words that we pray every time we gather as the Living Body of Christ. We know these words as the Lord's Prayer or the Our Father. During Jesus' time, it was common for Rabbis to teach their followers a prayer. This prayer was to be short and easy to memorize, and it was to summarize their teaching(s). John the Baptist did this for his disciples, and now Jesus's disciples were asking for the same consideration. They, of course, got more than they bargained for. In the words of the Lord's Prayer, we see what the Gospel is all about when it comes to our relationship with God.

Jesus begins by calling God, Our Father. This word tells us that in prayer, we are not coming to someone whom we must force or flatter to receive gifts. No, we are coming to a Father who takes great delight in supplying His children with what they need. Also, by calling God Our Father, we are placing God first in our prayers, as we acknowledge God's glory and the proper respect due Him. All of this is conducted before we make our petitions known. Only when we give God His proper place will other things take their proper place. The Lord's Prayer covers aspects of our entire life; it covers our present needs as we pray for our daily bread, and it helps us not to worry about tomorrow. It covers our past as we recall our sins and ask for forgiveness, and it deals with our future as we ask not to be led into temptation and to be delivered from evil (And these words may change a little to make more sense of this request).

To drive this point home, that our God is a loving Father, Jesus continues to tell us why we can indeed trust God. First, He tells us how we ourselves should act toward the people we love, how we can give them good things. As Jesus points out, if we who are sinful can still do good things, think how much more Our Father in Heaven (who is perfect) will do for us. Jesus also uses the example of the neighbor who comes in the middle of the night for some bread to offer to his guests who arrive so late. Remember last week how hospitality was so important, and how one had to respond to the needs of guests, no matter what or when! That is why the host is so persistent in knocking on the door of his neighbor. Even when he is told to go away, the host will not

give up. Therefore, as Jesus tells us, the homeowner gets up to meet the host's needs just so the host will go away. Our Lord is telling us that if we meet the needs of others, even if we are just doing it so they will go away, how much more will God answer our needs and do it without needing to be convinced.

Abraham knows this as he talks to God about the destruction that will happen to the cities on the plain. God decides to tell Abraham what He is about to do, and Abraham is sickened by the news. As we see, he begins to question God and even confronts the just judge of the entire world with the idea that it would be unfair to punish the innocent with the guilty. God agrees, and as we see, they go back and forth until Abraham gets God down to ten, just ten innocent people. God does not get angry with Abraham, nor does He tell Abraham to mind his own business. They have such a good relationship that God allows him to advocate for the innocent. As it was with Our Father in Faith, so it is for all of us. Why, because we belong to the Body of Christ and are empowered by God the Holy Spirit to have full confidence in God and freely call Him Our Father.





St. Edward's Religious Education Program is an 8 year faith formation program for children attending public schools or non Catholic private schools. Religious Education Students are required to begin their religious studies in Grade 1 and complete their formal religious education classes in Grade 8.

Preparation for their reception of First Confession and First Holy Communion takes place in Grades 1 and 2. Students will receive

their First Confession in March of Grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of same year. Grades 3 - 6 are required continuation years for their studies. Confirmation studies occurs in Grades 7 and 8, with their Confirmation in the Fall of 9th Grade.

In Person Religion Classes will begin the week of September 28th.

Did You Know...?



This Thursday, July 31st we celebrate the feast of Ignatius of Loyola. Saint Ignatius lived from 1491 to 1556. He was a Basque Spaniard Catholic priest and theologian, who, with six companions, founded the religious order of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), and became its first Superior General, in Paris in 1541.

Ignatius envisioned the purpose of the Society of Jesus to be missionary work and teaching. In addition to the vows of chastity, obedience and poverty of other religious orders in the church, Loyola instituted a fourth vow for Jesuits of obedience to the Pope, and to engage in projects ordained by the pontiff. Jesuits were instrumental in leading the Counter -Reformation.

Earlier in his life Ignatius was a soldier and fought in many battles. During one battle he was gravely injured. While recovering from surgery he underwent a spiritual conversion and discerned a call to religious life. Having formed the Jesuit order, he paid particular attention to the spiritual formation of his recruits and recorded his method in the *Spiritual Exercises* drawn up in 1548. In time, the method has become known as Ignatian spirituality. He was beatified in 1609 and was canonized as a saint on 12 March 1622.
