

#### From Fr. Mike's Desk

Our reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells us of Paul and Barnabas' arrival in Antioch in Pisidia. It tells how they first went to the synagogue to preach, for Paul always believed that in every city where there were Jews, he would preach the Gospel to them first. What we do not see in today's passage is what Paul preached about, but you can see it in Chapter 13 of Acts. Scholars tell us that this is one of Paul's greatest sermons on Salvation History. He connected Jesus to the House of David and told them how He is indeed the one who fulfills all the promises God made to David and to the promises God made to all the people through the Prophets. Paul even includes John the Baptist and how Jesus was handed over to Pilate out of jealousy. It appears that the people who consisted of Jews, new Jewish converts, and gentiles were looking for something new in their lives, and they were pleased with Paul. They were so pleased that they invited him back to speak at the next Sabbath. But the scholars tell us that something happened between the two Sabbaths, and Luke tells us it was jealousy. "When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse, contradicted what Paul said." The leaders were upset that Paul attracted so great a following in such a brief time, or after thinking about what was said about Jesus, they could no longer believe him. Either way, they were no longer receptive and ordered Paul and Barnabas to leave, and even started a persecution against them so that they had to leave the city.

Notice what Paul said in reply to their jealousy, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles...?" The Gentiles were delighted because they understood that the word of God and the Good News were now coming to them with all the stops pulled out. We must also remember that some of the Jews who heard Paul also became followers of Jesus, but we are to understand not in the same numbers as the Gentiles. Those who followed Paul and became Christians heard more than the voice of the Apostle; they heard the voice of the Holy Spirit, who conveyed to them the voice of Jesus, and thus they too became His sheep.

This is a wonderful example of what Jesus means in today's Gospel on this Good Shepherd Sunday. As Jesus said, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me." The people of Antioch heard Jesus call them, and they followed Him. They learned

how to attune their ears and their hearts to the sound of His voice and His alone. This same Good Shepherd is calling us to Himself, so do we have the ears to hear, do we have the will to focus on His voice and on the voice of the one who sent Him? How do we focus on His voice? We must spend time in prayer and meditation, read the Scriptures, and receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and we should also read the Lives of the Saints, as they can tell us how they heard the voice and followed it.

This Sunday is also a day we traditionally pray for vocations to the Priesthood as we ask the Holy Spirit to call men to follow in the footsteps of the Good Shepherd and to serve as He served. Please pray for an increase in vocations to the Priesthood and help foster them by asking a person you think might have a vocation if he has ever considered it. Encourage the idea of the Priesthood among your children or grand-children. Believe me, it is a very fulfilling life, and it is one I highly recommend. Sometimes all we need is someone to suggest it.

Happy Good Shepherd Sunday and Happy Easter, and Happy Mothers' Day to all our Mothers!

We are excited to announce that our Diocese will host a Eucharistic Congress on Sunday, June 8th, 2025, at St. Anthony's High School in Huntington, as part of the National Eucharistic Revival. This will be a powerful day of Mass with Bishop Barres, dynamic speakers, Eucharistic adoration, music, confession, and activities for all ages.

In the days leading up to the Congress, there will be two Eucharistic pilgrimages traveling through our Diocese from May 31st to June 8th:

- An Eastern Route beginning with a special Opening Mass at 10:00am in Montauk at the Church of St. Therese of Lisieux on May 31st.
- A Western Route beginning with an Opening Mass at the Cathedral of St. Agnes in Rockville Centre on the same day.

These pilgrimages will include public processions, parish stops, and times of prayer and worship, all culminating at the Eucharistic Congress on June 8th. You are invited to join any part of the route—whether walking, driving, or praying along the way.

## What is Good Shepherd Sunday?

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally called "Good Shepherd Sunday" because that is the theme of the Gospel. Jesus as Good Shepherd, the guardian of the sheepfold, is also an ecclesiological text: this is a theology of the Church. The Church is Christ's sheepfold. There are no lone sheep: the sheep who wanders from the flock, from the sheepfold, is in danger. He's not free, out to "define one's own concept of existence, of meaning, of the universe and of the mystery of human life." He's lost, exposed and in danger. He needs to be rescued. He needs to be saved. Today's Gospel speaks of how the sheep should act, but it's also an important lesson for shepherds: bishops, priests, all who have leadership roles in the Church. Their responsibility is to be like the Good Shepherd, speaking his voice and protecting the integrity of his sheepfold, out front leading.

## What is the Papacy?

With the pontificate of Pope Francis coming to an abrupt end, many may be wondering, especially non-believers, what is the papacy? This institution by Christ, is the special authority given to Saint Peter and passed through all who succeed him. Tradition in the early Church and throughout the centuries testifies that Peter (as well as Paul) established a Church in Rome obediently heeding our Lord's proclamation: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,"

**Matthew 28:19** - The special authority, more than just a "first among equals" entrusted to St. Peter is read in the most controversial Bible verses: "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

**Matthew 16:18-19** - Tradition also testifies that the authority conferred to the Apostles was not just applicable in their generation, but for all generations of the Church. Thus, the Apostles had successors which can be noticed in "and what you have heard from me through many witnesses entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others as well."

**2 Timothy 2:2** - The early Christians testify of this apostolic succession such as Pope Clement (the fourth bishop of Rome) in the first century: "And thus preaching through countries and cities, they appointed the first-fruits of their labours, having first proved them by the Spirit, to be bishops and deacons of those who should afterwards believe. Nor was this any new thing, since indeed many ages before it was written concerning bishops and deacons. For thus says the Scripture a certain place, "I will appoint their bishops in righteousness, and their deacons in faith."

Thus, the special authority given to St. Peter, has been passed down through all of his successors to this day. Through apostolic succession, these keys given to Peter were in the very possession of Pope Francis.
