

From Fr. Mike's Desk

As we come to the end of October and proceed to November, we enter a time known as Allhallows Tide (October 31-November 2). Of course, we know that October 31st is Halloween or the Eve of All Hallows (those who are holy). At first, people would use the 31st as a day to tidy up graves and pray for those who had passed on. It was not a day or night to be afraid, but it evolved into this as time went on. It also was not a night for candy and costumes as we know them today! This day was, of course, followed by All Saints Day, which is a day of great celebration as we remember all our brothers and sisters who are with God in Heaven. As the opening prayer of All Saints Day states, those in Heaven are praying for us still here on earth. As we read, "Almighty and everliving God, by whose gift we venerate in one celebration the merits of the Saints, bestow on us we pray, through the prayers of so many intercessors, an abundance of reconciliation with You for the Church ..."

We are honoring all the Saints, those whom we know, and asking them to pray for us. We are also honoring the Saints who we know, that is, those known to ourselves but not to the public. And we are asking the Saints whom we do not know to pray for us. In our prayers we are asking the Saints to guide us and help us, and we are also asking departed friends and relatives to pray for us. This day is usually a Holy Day of Obligation (except when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday).

Equally important is the day that follows, and that is today, All Souls' Day, also known as The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed. On this day, the roles are reversed, for on this day we are praying for those whom we love, and we are acknowledging that we miss them, and we hope they are in Heaven. When we have loved ones prayed for at Mass, we pray for the repose of their soul and for the forgiveness of any sins they left this world with. We are praying for them that they will be set free from these effects and join with the Saints in Heaven. We pray especially for the Souls in Purgatory, who have been set free from sin, but must totally cleanse their souls of anything that stands in the way. In Purgatory, we cannot pray

for ourselves, but we who are here can pray for them and set them free by our prayers. They can also move from Purgatory by the prayers they offer for others. As they rely on us, we can rely on them to pray for us. One's time in Purgatory is not the same, and there is one good thought: there is no sin in Purgatory, in the sense that the souls there are free from new sins and only must work on what they took with them from life here.

We close with the prayer from today's Mass, O God, glory of the faithful, and life of the just, by the Death and Resurrection of your Son we have been redeemed, look mercifully on your departed servants, that just as they professed the mystery of our resurrection, so they may merit to receive the joys of eternal happiness. Through Christ our Lord, Amen.

This responsibility for God's earth means that human beings, endowed with intelligence, must respect the laws of nature and the delicate equilibria existing between the creatures of this world, for "he commanded and they were created; and he established them for ever and ever; he fixed their bounds and he set a law which cannot pass away". Did You Know...

This coming Tuesday, November 4th, we venerate Saint Charles Borromeo. He was an Italian Catholic prelate who served as Archbishop of Milan from 1564 to 1584. He was made a cardinal in 1560, and was canonized in 1610.

Borromeo made efforts to restore the dignity to divine service. He urged churches to be designed in conformity with the decrees of the Council of Trent, which stated that sacred art and architecture lacking adequate scriptural foundation was in effect prohibited, as was any inclusion of classical pagan elements in religious art. He divided the nave of the church into two compartments to separate the sexes at worship. He extended his reforms to the collegiate churches, monasteries and even to the Confraternities of Penitents, particularly that of St. John the Baptist. This group was to attend to prisoners and those condemned to death, to give them help and support.

Borromeo believed that abuses in the church arose from ignorant clergy. Among his most important actions, he established seminaries, colleges, and communities for the education of candidates for holy orders. His emphasis on Catholic learning greatly increased the preparation of men for the priesthood and benefited their congregations.

If you or a loved one is sick, going in for surgery, or advanced in age and would like to receive this Sacrament please come to the Mass. The proper effects of the sacrament include a special grace of healing and comfort to the person who is suffering. Handmade prayer shawls will be blessed and are available after the Mass.
