



From Fr. Mike's Desk

"After this I had a vision of a great multitude which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice: 'Salvation comes from our God who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb.' " "Then one of the elders spoke up and said to me, 'Who are these wearing white robes, and where did they come from?' I said to him, 'My lord, you are the one who knows.' He said to me, 'These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made white in the Blood of the Lamb.' "

This passage from the Book of Revelation (Rev. 7:2-4, 9-14) appears every November 1st with the celebration of All Saints Day. It tells us how the Saints who went before us have become the great multitude in Heaven praising God. They got there by serving the Father and the Son in all things. The Gospel reading for All Saints Day is the same Gospel we have for today, The Beatitudes of Jesus. Nine statements of Blessings which come upon all those who truly follow Him. The connection between Revelation and Matthew for this wonderful day is that the Saints in Heaven lived out the Beatitudes. They were more than something that had to be memorized in religion class. They are the way we are to live our lives. As we see in our Old Testament Reading for today, Zephaniah tells the people that God will leave a remnant in our midst, a people humble and lowly. They will do no wrong and tell no lies, and they shall pasture the flock. While these words were spoken before the Assyrian and Babylonian invasions of the Northern and Southern Kingdoms, they were spoken to let the people know that God would not abandon His people, and that those who would return would be His people and live in a new way, the new way given to the world through the Messiah.

The Beatitudes are part of Jesus' new way; in effect, they can sum up the entire Gospel. They do indeed speak of a bright promise, not just for a holy remnant but for all who follow Jesus. Yes, they do indeed point to a bright promise, but they are calling Christians into a life which the rest of the world would not consider pleasant. Look at them carefully; each unpleasant thing that we experience here leads to greater fulfillment in Heaven and even here on Earth. Each unpleasant thing calls us to a life we experience beyond this life. Without a doubt, they are paradoxical. How can something like mourning, being meek,

hunger and thirsting for righteousness, or facing persecution, insult, and injury lead to happiness? This makes no human sense! But we are not speaking about these things from purely human wisdom; no, we are speaking from a position of Divine Wisdom. Divine Wisdom makes more sense to us when we take the time to pay attention to it. This, of course, can only happen when we allow the Holy Spirit to speak directly to our heart and soul. And this can only happen when we take the time and make the effort to not place our total trust in society's wisdom.

As Paul tells us in his First Letter to the Corinthians, "...Rather, God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise." Today the challenge is before us to be fools for Christ and to allow His wisdom to come into us. We are to follow the Beatitudes to the best of our abilities, and to follow the examples given to us, in the Good Samaritan, the Prodigal Son, Matthew Chapter 25, and so much more. Are you willing to be Wisdom's Fool?





How To Have A Good Lent

Just how do we have a good Lent? The Church gives us the guidelines, the 3 pillars being fasting, prayer and almsgiving. Do you notice that nothing is said about giving something up for Lent? A Lenten resolution? When we get down to the basics, Lent is about only one thing—**growing deeper in our relationship with the Lord**.

Now most Catholics abide by the fast and abstinence rules for Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and Fridays during Lent, and increase their almsgiving to others, but neglect a change in their prayer habits. If we are truly going to grow in a relationship with Jesus Christ, increasing our time and persevering in prayer is exactly where we need to start.

This year, Holy Name of Jesus and St. Edward's churches would like to give you a great opportunity to join in prayer together by offering a Lenten Rosary on the **6 Sundays of Lent at 3 PM**, the hour of Christ's death and the hour that Christ asked for the Divine Mercy Chaplet to be said. Sunday's are ideal as it is the The Lord's Day; Jesus taught the Sabbath was for human benefit, a day of rest and prayer, to refresh our souls. What better sacrifice can we make than giving up our mundane everyday activities in favor of spending time in prayer? Let us redefine how we keep The Lord's Day; by spending time with Him, we will grow IN our relationship with Him.

The rosary that we will offer will be a complete rosary with the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious Mysteries accompanied by scriptures that help us meditate on the complete life of Christ starting with his conception; the addition of scriptures helps us develop a deeper knowledge of God.

So what better way to develop a deeper relationship with God, which is our Lenten mission, than by reading/listening to his Word, the Bible, and contemplating the life of Christ through the mysteries of the rosary? 
