From Fr. Mike's Desk

"I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race... and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain, for the old order has passed away.' The one who sat on the throne said, 'Behold I will make all things new...'"

These words of promise, which will be fulfilled when the Kingdom of God is realized in its full glory, are given to us now to help us know that the world is different. The world is no longer a place of darkness, spiritual death, and sin. Now you may say, what world are you living in? It is not the world that I am living in! Unfortunately, this is not the world I am living in either, but it is the world I am looking forward to coming to, and it is the world that is slowly appearing right here and now. How can I say this? It is easy because of Jesus. Jesus has and is changing the world because He has changed us. We, the members of the Church, are to make the world look more like what is described above from the Book of Revelation. We are supposed to be working on this every day, and we cannot stop until we are called home to Heaven, or Christ returns in His full glory.

We believe that this recreation is possible. Christ would not have called us to accomplish it if it were not. God does not call us to do anything we cannot do, but we must keep in mind that it is not my job or your job, it's our job, and we are called to do this together, and we do all with the untiring help and love of the Good Shepherd. While evil is winning, and we are moving backwards, we must never forget that evil will never win because you cannot defeat the power of the Holy Spirit. So, how do we not allow setbacks and the fact that so many will not listen to us to get us down? How do we not lose hope? Part of the answer, in fact a large part, is seen in today's Gospel when Jesus gives us His new "] commandment. give vou a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." This is a more serious commitment to love, it means to do what Jesus did for us, even

unto giving up our lives for Him. This does not mean we all have to become martyrs, but it does mean we must always be ready to put Jesus and the Gospel first. We should live our lives dedicated to our families, our community, and each other. This is what love is all about.

As we get back to the Gospel account, notice how Jesus waits for Judas to leave the Upper Room before He gives this commandment of perfect love. That is because Judas, even after seeing all that Jesus could do and hearing all that Jesus said, was still thinking only about what he wanted. Judas was still thinking with the wisdom of the world and not the wisdom of God, who was right in front of him. Now the question during this Easter Season and beyond is, do you want to be like Judas and betray Jesus, or do you want to assemble before the throne of the Lamb? As God tells us in the Book of Deuteronomy, I give you all these things so you may have life, so choose life.

Did You Know...

Pope Leo XIV - born Robert Francis Prevost on September 14, 1955) is now the head of the Catholic Church and sovereign of the Vatican City State. He was elected in the 2025 papal conclave as the successor to Pope Francis.

Born and raised in the Chicago area, Prevost became a friar of the Order of Saint Augustine in 1977 and was ordained as a priest in 1982. His service has included extensive missionary work in Peru in the 1980s and 1990s, where he variously served as a parish pastor, diocesan official, seminary teacher, and administrator. Elected prior general of the Order of Saint Augustine from 2001 to 2013, he later returned to Peru as Bishop of Chiclayo from 2015 to 2023. In 2023, Pope Francis appointed him prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops and president of the Pontifical Commission for Latin America, and made him a cardinal the same year.

As a cardinal, he emphasized synodality, missionary dialogue, and engagement with social and technological challenges. He also engaged with issues such as climate change, global migration, church governance, and human rights, and expressed alignment with the reforms of the Second Vatican Council.

A United States citizen by birth, Leo XIV is the first pope to have been born in North America, the first to hold Peruvian citizenship (having been naturalized in 2015), the second pope from the Americas (after his predecessor Francis), and the first from the Order of Saint Augustine. His papal name was inspired by Pope Leo XIII, who developed modern Catholic social teaching amidst the Second Industrial Revolution. Leo XIV believes the ongoing Fourth Industrial Revolution, and particularly advances in artificial intelligence and robotics, to pose "new challenges for the defense of human dignity, justice and labor". Let us pray for Pope Leo XIX as he leads our church into the future.
