From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. This feast is a devotional feast, meaning that this feast does not mark a particular event like the Nativity or the Resurrection. However, it is designed to promote a devotion to the Holy Family, so it can serve as a model for modern family life. This Feast was added to the Church's Calendar by Pope Leo XIII in 1893 and was first celebrated on the Sunday after the Feast of the Epiphany. The Second Vatican Council moved the Feast to be remembered on the Sunday that falls between Christmas and the Epiphany, thus linking it closer to Christmas. This also reminds us that God's presence is not only seen in Jesus, the babe of Bethlehem, but also as a member of a human family (the whole human family from age to age).

Many times, when we contemplate the Holy Family, we interpret this to mean that they were always happy. While I am sure that many times, they were happy, there were also many times they were unhappy, or had to face their share of trouble, just like our families. After all, families that are always happy can only be found on television of the 1950's, 60's, and the 70's. Yes, they had their troubles, as we can see in the various Gospel accounts for this day (i.e., The Flight to Egypt or how upset Joseph and Mary were when they could not find Jesus in Jerusalem until they came to the Temple). Like all families, they knew the loss of loved ones, especially as St. Joseph died before Jesus began His Public Ministry. So, how did they get through all these encounters and some even tougher predicaments? They relied on their strong faith in God, which was the very same faith that allowed the Blessed Mother to say yes when the Archangel Gabriel appeared to her, just as Joseph had when he was told in a dream whose child she was carrying. The same strong faith that brought the Holy Family to the Temple to fulfill the Law of Moses, likewise helped our dear Mother to hear and ponder the words uttered by Simeon and Anna.

This is the same faith that helped other Scriptural Families accomplish so much. It helped Abraham leave his household and travel to the Holy Land as he believed God's promises to him would be fulfilled, and it allowed Moses' mother to put him in a small ark and send him down the Nile, knowing that God would save her son. This is the same faith that can help us when we are faced with troubles or demanding situations. Bear in mind that this faith may not make the trouble go away, but it will give us the strength to face trouble,

endure it, and hopefully gain insight to grow from the experience. No, family is perfect, but each family should strive to do their best to love one another, to forgive one another, and support each other. This is what makes a family holy, and this is what we found in Nazareth, and what we can see and find in Syosset and Woodbury.

We close with the Blessing of Families from the Book of Blessings. We bless your name O Lord for sending your own Son to become part of a family, so that as He lived His life, He would experience its worries and joys. We ask you, Lord, to protect and watch over our families, so that in the strength of your grace we may enjoy prosperity and possess the priceless gift of your Peace. May the Lord Jesus, who lived with His Holy Family in Nazareth, dwell also with our families, keep us from all evil, and make us all one in heart and mind. Amen


