#### From Fr. Mike's Desk

Many times, we have seen in the Gospel accounts someone would approach Jesus with a question, or a moral situation. This was a common occurrence during Jesus' time because the question which was asked was to lead to a debate. The debates could go on for a long time and may not reach a conclusion that either side liked or agreed with. However, sometimes the debate could help the other person see the logic and reason behind the teaching of the first party. When it came to a person like Jesus, who looked at the Law differently from others, and who had a new teaching, it was designed usually to trap Him, so that they could use His answer to denounce Him and declare that He certainly could not be the Messiah. As we have also seen, the person who tried to trap Jesus, could not because He spoke with His own authority, the authority of the Son of God.

Today we see a scholar of the Law presenting Jesus with a particularly important question, "'Which is the first of all the commandments?" However, there is a difference with this scribe. He is not trying to trap Jesus or engage Him in debate for debate's sake. He genuinely wants to hear Jesus' answer as he hopes to learn from Jesus. Jesus's answer comes right from what we see stated in our first reading of Deuteronomy. Moses tells the people to follow all the statutes and commandments given to them by God. He tells them, "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart...soul...and with all your strength." So, Jesus' answer is that which we see above, but His answer does not stop there. Jesus adds a second commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no greater commandment than Our Lord has done what no one has done before. He has united the love of God with the love of neighbor. Jesus also has expanded the definition of neighbor. Before Jesus, a Jew's neighbor was simply another Jew. Therefore, one did not have to consider others, now Jesus has told them that everyone was their neighbor no matter where they come from.

Now we might think that the scribe would be upset with His answer, yet he is not. And he answers Jesus with, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, He is the One and there is no other than He. And to love him with all your heart...understanding...strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." This person got it! He knew what truly is important in God's eyes. Now in no way was Jesus or the scribe putting down worship. No, they were placing worship in its proper place. Meaning that worship is indeed important, but if you focus only on worship and ignore the needs of others, we will be failing in our call to be true disciples. If all that matters to me is

that I offer up my prayers and sacrifices, and I think nothing about my neighbor, then my prayers and sacrifices are not as effective. We are to bring our worship, our prayers, and our sacrifices into every action of our lives. Remember the Eucharist is given to us by God so that we can be empowered to make God present. Christ gives us His very Body and Blood, Humanity, and Divinity, so we can always stay close to Him and so He can stay close to us. When we put all of ourselves into our prayers and worship and expand that to outside the Church or home, we are absolutely loving God above all things and our neighbor too. This will allow us to hear Our Lord telling us, "You are not far from the kingdom of God."

Today November 3<sup>rd</sup> at 3:00 PM we will celebrate our annual Mass of Remembrance for All Souls' Day. We will remember all those who died during this past year as well as all our loved ones who have gone home to God.

- 1. We are not all soldiers.
- 2. Reserves are part of the military.
- 3. Not everyone in the military is infantry (in tanks, on patrol, etc.).
- 4. Military has leaders at every level in the chain of command.
- 5. Military is always on duty.
- 6. Take pride in appearance and conduct.
- 7. We did not all kill someone.
- 8. We do not all have PTSD.
- Those of us who do have invisible wounds of war are not dangerous or violent.
- 10. It's hard to ask for help.
- 11. Our military service changes us.
- We differ in how much we identify with the military after we leave active duty.
- 13. Our families serve with us.
- 14. We would die for each other and our country.
- 15. We all made this sacrifice for one reason: to serve something more important than ourselves.

#### Did You Know...

Monday, November 4th is the Memorial of Saint Charles Borromeo. Although he belonged to the Milanese nobility and was related to the powerful Medici family, Charles desired to devote himself to the Church. In 1559, when his uncle, Cardinal de Medici was elected Pope Pius IV, he made Charles cardinal-deacon and administrator of the Archdiocese of Milan. At the time Charles was still a layman and a young student. Because of his intellectual qualities Charles was entrusted with several important offices connected with the Vatican, and later appointed secretary of state with responsibility for the papal states. The untimely death of his elder brother brought Charles to a definite decision to be ordained a priest, despite his relatives' insistence that he marry. Soon after being ordained a priest at age 25, Borromeo was consecrated bishop of Milan.

Working behind the scenes, Saint Charles deserves the credit for keeping the Council of Trent in session when at several points it was on the verge of breaking up. Borromeo encouraged the pope to renew the Council in 1562, after it had been suspended for 10 years. He took upon himself the task of the entire correspondence during the final phase. Because of his work at the Council, Borromeo was unable to take up residence in Milan until the Council concluded.

Charles took the initiative in giving a good example. He allotted most of his income to charity, forbade himself all luxury, and imposed severe penances upon himself. He sacrificed wealth, high honors, esteem, and influence to become poor. During the plague and famine of 1576, Borromeo tried to feed 60,000 to 70,000 people daily. To do this he borrowed large sums of money that required years to repay. As civil authorities fled at the height of the plague, he stayed in the city, where he ministered to the sick and the dying, helping those in want. Work and the heavy burdens of his high office began to affect Archbishop Borromeo's health, leading to his death at the age of 46. He was canonized on November 1, 1610.


