From Fr. Mike's Desk

During the Season of Lent, one of the areas of our faith community that we focus on a great deal is the OCIA (the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults). This wonderful ministry helps prepare people to become full members of the Catholic Church. The people who come to the OCIA can come from a non-Christian Faith, called by the Holy Spirit to join the Body of Christ, or they can come from other Christian Communities who wish to come into full communion with the Church. This is a great blessing for us as they remind us of the wonderful gift our faith is to us. God also blessed us with a talented OCIA Team who volunteer to share their faith and guide those called to the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Lent is the time for final preparations, so those seeking to enter the Church will be ready at the Easter Vigil. Part of the preparation process is to have a separate set of readings during some of the Sundays of Lent. The readings for OCIA alternatives come from the Lectionary Cycle A.

This year our Gospel comes from Luke's Gospel, The Parable of the Prodigal Son, but in Cycle A the reading comes from John's Gospel, and it is the account of the Man Born Blind. In this account, Jesus restores sight to the man as a sign that He came into the world to bring light. As you will recall, this started a controversy between Jesus and the priests of the Temple, because He cured the man on the Sabbath. Jesus then hinted that the High Priest and the Religious Leaders of Israel were the ones who were blind, because they could not see who He was. This did not go over well with them, nor did it go over well with the elder son in Luke's Gospel when his father was hinting that he too was blind as to what was happening with the return of his wayward brother.

Now, many of us may side with the older brother in this story. After all, he was always loyal to his father; he did all the work and did not hurt his father the way the younger brother did. The younger brother demanded that his father give him his share of the inheritance so he could move away and be free. This son did not even wait for his father to die to collect his share. What a nice kid! No doubt, he sinned against his father and God, yet his father did not give up on him, as we are told, that he would go out and look for him every day. Moreover, when the son came back after spending all his money, the loving father was filled with compassion. He forgave his son and

welcomed him home. As he tells the older son; "My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must rejoice, because your brother was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found." As the father dealt with his younger son. So does God deal with us! As the Father sent His Son into the world to help us achieve reconciliation (as we see in Paul's Letter), so He sent us to help forgive each other. As hard as that is to do, we must, for how can we ask God for forgiveness if we will not forgive others? To not forgive makes us like the High Priest and the Pharisees from both Gospels, for today we are blind if we are trying to judge. Remember, the one thing God did not give us was the right to judge one another. Leave that to God, for when we judge, we judge too harshly and in a way that God never does. If you do not believe me, look at the father in the parable. He is really God the Father; remember, there are times when we play both sons. Now, who would you want to judge you, the older brother, or God, the loving Father? I will take God any day.



Journey to the Foot of the Cross

Bishop David L. Ricken of Green Bay, Wisconsin, former chairman of the Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis, offers "10 Things to Remember for Lent". The first 4 things were in the last two bulletin, and next week, 2 more things.

- **5. It's about dying to yourself.** The more serious side of Lenten discipline is that it's about more than self-control it's about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like and letting them die. The suffering and death of Christ are foremost on our minds during Lent, and we join in these mysteries by suffering, dying with Christ and being resurrected in a purified form.
- **6. Don't do too much.** It's tempting to make Lent some ambitious period of personal reinvention, but it's best to keep it simple and focused. There's a reason the Church works on these mysteries year after year. We spend our entire lives growing closer to God. Don't try to cram it all in one Lent. That's a recipe for failure.

At a recent Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.) meeting Deacon Jim Murphy anointed JULIA AUGELLO, SAMANTHA AUGELLO and RACHEL CICIO with the oil of the Catechumen. The anointing with the Oil of Catechumens is intended to signify the need for divine strength, so that the one to be baptized, may steadfastly take the step of professing their faith and hold it unfailingly throughout his or her life. This oil is blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass during Holy Week and is kept in the AMBRY – the little cabinet on the wall by the Baptismal font.

Did You Know....?

What do we really know about Judas Iscariot, "The Betrayer..." (part 1 of 2 part series)

Judas Iscariot was an only son of wealthy Jewish parents living in Jericho. He had become attached to John the Baptist, and his Sadducee parents had disowned him. He was looking for employment in these regions when Jesus' apostles found him, and chiefly because of his experience with finances, Nathaniel invited him to join their ranks. Judas was the only Judean among the twelve apostles. Judas was born in Kerioth, small town in southern Judea. When he was a lad, his parents moved to Jericho, where he lived and had been employed in his father's various businesses until he became interested in the preaching and work of John the Baptist.

When Nathaniel met Judas at Tarichea, he was seeking employment with a fish-drying enterprise at the lower end of the Sea of Galilee. He was thirty years of age and unmarried when he joined the apostles. Hew was probably the best educated man among the twelve and the only Judean in the Master's apostolic family. Judas had no outstanding trait of personal strength, though he had many outwardly appearing traits of culture and habits of training. He was a good thinker but not always a truly honest thinker.

Judas Iscariot has long been one of the most fascinating characters in the New Testament. As Jesus' betrayer, he has an unequaled notoriety – and rightly so.

Scripture is clear in naming him as the turncoat, but his motivation has been the subject of speculation. How could anyone knowingly commit such a horrible act against the innocent Lamb of God, the Savior of the world? Some explanations seem designed to mitigate Judas' guilt by portraying him as one who was not so much sinister as weak, confused or simply trying to be helpful.

This Sunday gets its name from the first few words of the traditional Latin entrance verse for the Mass of the day. "Laetare Jerusalem" ("Rejoice, O Jerusalem") is Latin from Isaiah 66:10.

Pope Francis - Catechesis for the weekly General Audience

As Pope Francis recovers in his residence after being discharged from the hospital, he has called on the faithful to never lose hope, for God always grants us the possibility of starting over. In his catechesis, focusing on encounters in Jesus' life, the Pope focused on the biblical episode of the Samaritan Woman recounted in the Gospel of St. John.

At our 'crossroads' - The Samaritan woman meets Jesus at a well, where He asks her for water and reveals that He is the Messiah. Through their conversation, He exposes her past and offers her "living water," symbolizing eternal life. Transformed by this encounter, she leaves her water jar, runs to her village, and brings others to Jesus. After contemplating the encounter between Jesus and Nicodemus, who went in search of Jesus, and the Samaritan woman, the Pope observed that we are reflecting on moments where Jesus shows that He is waiting "right there," at that "crossroads" in our life. He recognized how this could have been somewhat shocking for the Samaritan woman, who likely felt ashamed of her life. "Perhaps she felt judged, condemned, and not understood," said the Pope, recalling that she had had five husbands and now was with a sixth who was not her husband. To go to Galilee from Judea, he observed, Jesus would have had to choose another road and not pass through Samaria. Yet, Pope Francis marveled, "He wants to pass through there, and stops at that very well, right at that time!"

Jesus waiting when we've lost hope - This, the Pope underscored, shows how "Jesus waits for us" and "lets Himself be found precisely when we think that there is no hope left for us." "He helps her to reread her history, which is complicated and painful," the Pope said, recalling how she discovers that the Messiah loves her. The Pope asked, "What proclamation could she have brought, if not her experience of being understood, welcomed, forgiven?" He added that this "should make us reflect on our search for new ways to evangelize."

Leaves behind her troubled life - Just like a person in love, the Samaritan forgets her water jar, leaving it at Jesus' feet. "The weight of that jar on her head, every time she returned home," the Pope recognized, "reminded her of her condition, her troubled life. But now the jar is left at Jesus' feet." At this point, he noted, "the past is no longer a burden; she is reconciled," noting, "it is like this for us too." "To go and proclaim the Gospel," the Holy Father said, "we first need to set down the burden of our history at the feet of the Lord, to consign to Him the weight of our past." "Dear brothers and dear sisters," the Holy Father underscored, "let us not lose hope! Even if our history appears burdensome, complicated, perhaps even ruined to us, we always have the possibility of consigning it to God and setting out anew on our journey."
