From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you...Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance...Then you shall be radiant at what you see...Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Midian, Ephah: all from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, proclaiming the praises of the Lord.

The Prophet Isaiah tells Israel what a great destiny it will have, as all nations will come to her to grow in the light and love of God. While they did not exactly know how that would be accomplished, we certainly do, as we see the prophecy fulfilled in the life, death, and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We see this especially in what we celebrate today, on this, **the Feast of the Epiphany**. This feast and its theme remind me of a day I experienced while I was on my Pastoral Year (way back in 1988). One day, we took the Sixth Grade Religious Education Class to the local Synagogue to learn more about Judaism. We did this because in the sixth grade, the subject matter is the Old Testament and the Jewish roots of Christianity. While we were there, the Rabbi asked the kids if they had any questions, and of course, they did. One child asked if they had Communion. The Rabbi said no, and he handled the question very well, as he talked about the Passover and explained that the Eucharist was a Passover Meal. Then one child asked about Heaven and Easter, and the Rabbi stated that they do believe in Heaven, and that good people go there, but then he added their idea of Heaven, and the Resurrection is a little different from ours. For our Jewish brothers and sisters, the resurrection was a continuation of this life, but only on a different plane of existence. This is different from what Jesus tells us. He explained the Resurrection is far more than a continuation of this life; it is a complete transformation to something entirely new. In the resurrection, we take on the Glorified Body, but more about this on Easter Sunday.

The Rabbi then added that Judaism is not like Christianity, for it does not see itself as a salvation religion. The goal of Judaism is to be the faith and life of Jewish people alone, and it is not a faith that usually calls others to it (but there are occasions when this happens) or to its relationship with God. This is the total opposite of what Christianity is all about, for Christ came into the world and became one of us to call all people to God. People from every place, language, race, and color, all called to become members of the one, true, living Body of Christ, the Church. Again, this is what we perceive so beautifully today in the story of the Epiphany, as the Messiah did not come just for one people or generation, but for all. The Magi come as representatives of the Gentiles, bringing gifts fit for royalty (gold, frankincense,

and myrrh). However, the truly priceless gift that they brought the King of Kings is the gift of the total human race. Just as Jesus is the gift of the Father to us. The great visit of the Magi tells us not just about an event that happened in Bethlehem 2,026 years ago, it also tells us why this child's birth, which we are currently celebrating, came in the first place.

This month, we will celebrate *Catholic Schools' Month*, and it promises to be a great month. We will have *Open House* hours where you can come, tour the school, and see all the good things that **St. Edward's School** has to offer your children, grandchildren, cousins, and neighbors' kids. During this month, you can meet our principal, **Ms. Annmarie Lomanto**, and many of our teachers. A Catholic Education provides your child with all they need to know about this world, and with all they need to know about the world to come. It provides them with all the tools they need to change the world and to do their part in building up the church and the Kingdom of God. **Please feel free to call the school at: (516) 921-7767; you will be happy you did.**

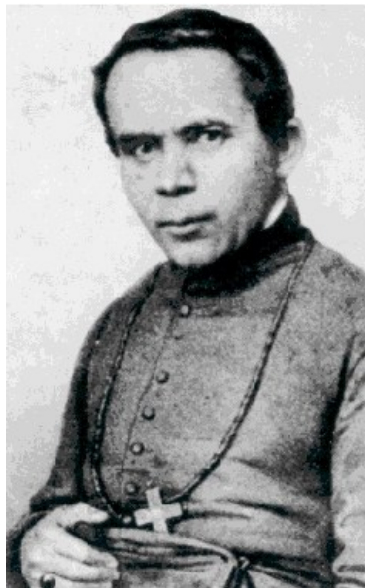

St. John Neumann



John Nepomucene Neumann, an immigrant from Bohemia (Czech Republic), came to the United States in 1836, where he was ordained, joined the Redemptorist order, and became the fourth Bishop of Philadelphia in 1852. In Philadelphia, Neumann founded the first Catholic diocesan school system in the US. Canonized in 1977, he is the only male US citizen to be named a saint. In 1980, Our Lady of the Angels College, founded by the congregation of Franciscan Sisters he had founded and located within the archdiocese, was renamed Neumann College. It was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 2009. The St. John Neumann Education Trust was established in 2017 in the Diocese of Manchester, New Hampshire, for the advancement of Catholic education.

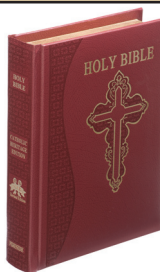
