From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Pilate then summoned the chief priests, the rulers and the people and said to them, 'You brought this man to me and accused him of inciting the people to revolt. I have conducted my investigation in your presence and have not found this man guilty of the charges you have brought against him, nor did Herod, for he sent him back to us. So, he has committed no capital crime'...But all together, they shouted out, 'Away with the man! Release Barabbas to us!' Again, Pilate addressed them, still wishing to release Jesus but they continued their shouting, 'Crucify him! Crucify him!'"

We sometimes read this account of Jesus' Trial and Passion, and we may say to ourselves, why did the people in the crowd call for the release of Barabbas, and demand Jesus' death? Well, there is probably some truth in the idea that Barabbas' supporters, who on that day included the Jewish leadership, shouted louder than the supporters of Jesus, but there is much more to this than we can ever imagine. There would have to be, because some in the crowd were the very same people who welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem with palm branches and were shouting, "Hosanna and blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" What made them stop believing in Him? After all they saw everything, he did and listened to everything He said, and they were still swayed by the Scribes and the Sadducees and lies that the Priests told about Jesus. The leaders convinced the people that it was better for them to forget about Jesus, for He was not the promised one. Since the people's faith was weak, they had no problem walking away. The leaders also convinced those gathered to demand Jesus' death, for it was better for one man to die, than for Rome to come and destroy all the people!

How could the people be taken in by the leaders so fast? We may wonder and we may say, *"If I were there, I would never have given in!"* Well, that was true for many who were there on that first **Good Friday**, as the Gospel tells us that crowds lined the way to **Golgotha**, crying and some even trying to help Jesus. Even though the Apostles fled out of fear for their lives, they eventually came back to their senses and allowed their faith in Jesus to grow. So, neither you nor I would have weakened, but there is also the possibility that we could.

On this Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, we should ask ourselves how many times in this life have we denied Christ, and how many times have we called out for today's equivalent of Barabbas? I am sure that if we look at our lives, we can find at least one time, but do not get upset, because even the Apostles denied Him and ran away, and Our Lord forgave them. Jesus would not let this stand in the way of them being with Him and allowing them to serve Him. For as we have seen in the past few weeks, Jesus forgives us constantly and He does it all by the Wood of His Cross, which is our focus on the Sunday. Of course, next Sunday we will focus, with boundless joy, upon the empty tomb. And this leads us back to the statement of the High Priest, when he said it was better for one man to die for the sake of the people. He was correct, but not for the reason he placed before the people. He was correct because in the Divine Truth of the Crucifixion and Resurrection, it is not one nation that is being saved, it is all nations. Nations that are not being set free from the slavery of Rome, but nations and generations being set free from the slavery to sin and spiritual death. Yes, all of this was accomplished by the death of one man, and the only person who could do this was/is the Messiah, the Son of God, who took on our humanity.

Soon we enter the holiest week of the Church's Year, and during this week, we will retrace the last moments of Jesus' life, and we will remember His death on the Cross on Good Friday. On Holy Thursday, we will recall the Institution of the Priesthood and The Eucharist and spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament in the Holy Family Room. On Monday, we will hear Confessions from 3:00 PM – 9:00 PM on Diocesan *Day for Confessions*. Please note that on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday Morning there is no 9 AM Mass since Mass is not allowed on these days, but we will have Morning Prayer at 9 AM.

Next Week's Gospel Question

In John's Gospel we hear that Mary of Magdala, having gone to the tomb and seeing that Jesus was missing, ran to Simon Peter and the 'other disciple whom Jesus loved', and reported that *"they have taken the Lord"*. Peter and the other disciple ran to the tomb, and believed that Jesus had been taken to an unknown place, which weighed heavily on them and the other disciples.

We know that this Gospel passage has a different ending. We also believe that Jesus is the living Christ and always near to us. Why then do we often despair at our circumstances, and feel far from Jesus and His loving embrace?

* **Tenebrae** - "Watch and pray," Jesus tells his apostles in the garden of Gethsemane, "that you may not enter into temptation." He invites them to pray for courage and strength as they will be confronted with His betrayal, arrest, false condemnation, passion and crucifixion. We, who are baptized into Jesus' death and resurrection, also hear His call, especially in Holy Week, to watch and pray as we commemorate these most sacred and life-giving days in our own lives and in the history of the world.


The major liturgies of The Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the Good Friday Service and the great Easter Vigil are our principal ways of prayerfully commemorating the events that won our salvation. But our Tradition also offers other ways to watch and pray during these holy days. The Liturgy of the Hours is prayed with great intensity and beauty during Holy Week. Many of you join the Office of Morning Prayer which our parish celebrates on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday mornings.

As we did last year, we will again be praying an evening office in the ancient Christian **tradition known as Tenebrae**. The word is Latin for darkness. The office commemorates the growing darkness enveloping Jesus as he faces the betrayal and arrest that lead to his passion. As the psalms are prayed and the scriptures are read, the candles of the church are extinguished one by one until the church is left in darkness. A loud thunder sound is heard. One lit candle remains, hidden away, as a sign that the darkness cannot completely overcome the Light, that the Cross leads to Resurrection.

Tenebrae is one of the most moving services of Holy Week. It offers a wonderful opportunity to "watch and pray" as we enter into these sacred days. Join us on April 16th, the Wednesday night of Holy Week at 7:30 PM and enter into this great prayer experience.

9. Reach out in charity. As we experience weakness and suffering during Lent, we should be renewed in our compassion for those who are hungry, suffering, or otherwise in need. The third part of the Lenten formula is almsgiving. It's about more than throwing a few extra dollars in the collection plate; it's about reaching out to others and helping them without question as a way of sharing the experience of God's unconditional love.


10. Learn to love like Christ. Giving of ourselves amid our suffering and self-denial brings us closer to loving like Christ, who suffered and poured himself out unconditionally on the cross for all of us. Lent is a journey through the desert to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, as we seek Him out, ask for His help, join in His suffering, and learn to love like Him.

Did You Know....?

A brief history of Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday is the Christian moveable feast the falls on the Sunday before Easter. The feast commemorates Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, an event mentioned in each of the four canonical Gospels. Its name originates from the palm branches waved by the crowd to greet and honor Jesus Christ as he entered the city. Palm Sunday marks the first day of Holy Week; in Western Christianity, this is the beginning of the last week of the solemn season of Lent, preceding Eastertide, while in Eastern Christianity, Holy Week commences after the conclusion of Great Lent.

In most Christian rites, Palm Sunday is celebrated by the blessing and distribution of palm branches (or the branches of other, native trees), representing the palm branches that the crowd scattered before Christ as rode into Jerusalem. These palms are sometimes woven into crosses. The difficulty of procuring palms led to the substitution of branches of native trees, including box, olive, willow, and yes.

Many churches of mainstream Christian denominations, including Orthodox, Catholic, Lutheran, Methodist, Anglican, Moravian, and Reformed traditions, distribute palm branches to their congregations during their palms, which are often blessed by clergy, to their homes, where they hang them alongside Christian art (especially crosses and crucifixes) or keep them in their Bibles and daily devotional books. In the days preceding the next year's Lent, know as Carnival or Shrovetide, churches often place a basket in their narthex to collect these palms, which are ritually burned on Shrove Tuesday to make the ashes to be used on the following day, Ash Wednesday, which is the first day of Lent.
