From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary." See, even two thousand years ago, the Disciples of Christ were questioning prayer and asking if it does any good. Sometimes we have all asked that question or have something like, "Pray, that's all I do is pray, and it seems like no one is listening." Or "God answers other people's prayers, but He never seems to answer mine!" Today's readings are given to us to see that both statements are false. Oh, sure, I would agree that God does not answer our prayers the way we want them answered, but He will and does answer every prayer we offer. How can we believe that? Well, just look at the story from the Old Testament. As long as Moses held his arms up in prayer, Israel was able to defeat Amalek. However, when he got tired or lowered his arms, Amalek got the better of the fight. While Moses did not utter any words, he knew that God was undeniably with the people if he kept faith in God's promises. So, on that day, the prayers of Israel were answered.

Jesus, in the parable, tells of the unjust judge who decides to rule in the widow's favor. As we are told, he does so, not because he fears God or man, but because he is afraid of the widow. A little background will be helpful. This judge is not a Jewish Judge; he does not follow the traditions and laws of Israel. In fact, if he did, he would be one of three judges who would hear this case. If this were the case (no pun intended), the widow could even choose one of the judges. No, he is a judge who sits on the bench according to Herod's rule, or he might even be one who was appointed by Rome. That is why he has absolute power. We are made to understand (according to biblical scholars) that the original Greek words of the text translate to tell us that the widow has indeed threatened to use actual physical violence toward the judge. She was not a lady to mess with. So, Jesus tells us that the judge, being a wise man, gives the widow what she wants. Our Lord then goes on to say, if this unjust person would give in to the widow, how much more will a Loving God, gladly seek to answer our prayers and supplications. So do not give up on prayer, Jesus tells us!

But why must we pray so hard sometimes, and why does it seem God is not listening? Again, God does listen, and He always answers our prayers, but remember He listens and answers them according to what He knows is right and best for us or for those for whom we are praying. God knows that sometimes getting what we ask for or what we want will be harmful in the future days or years ahead. God is not selfish, nor does He seek to harm us. We can only fully understand this when we see things using the eyes of faith. **As William Barclay** writes in his commentary on today's Gospel, "Only God sees the

whole, and therefore, only God knows what is good for us overall. That is why Jesus said we must never be discouraged in prayer. That is why He wondered if men's faith would stand the prolonged delays before the Son of Man shall come [return]. We will never grow weary in prayer, and our faith will never falter if, after we have offered to God our prayers and requests, we add the perfect prayer: Thy will be done."

We now close with the words Our Savior taught us:
Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by thy name.
Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil (For thine is the Kingdom, the Power, and the Glory, forever) Amen.

Aside from the Sacrifice of the Mass, this is the most perfect prayer as it comes directly from the Son of God's mouth.

Keep up your prayers!



Did You Know...

In the Catholic Church, "the faithful" refers essentially to baptized Catholics; "all souls" commemorates the church penitent of souls in purgatory, whereas "all saints" commemorates the church triumphant of saints in heaven. In the liturgical books of the Latin Church it is called the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. The Catholic Church teaches that the purification of the souls in purgatory can be assisted by the actions of the faithful on earth. Its teaching is based also on the practice of prayer for the dead mentioned as far back as 2 Maccabees 12:42-46.[13] The theological basis for the feast is the doctrine that the souls which, on departing from the body, are not perfectly cleansed from venial sins, or have not fully atoned for past transgressions, are debarred from the Beatific vision, and that the faithful on earth can help them by prayers, alms, deeds, and especially by the sacrifice of the Holy Mass.

On All Souls' Day, Christians of various denominational backgrounds, including Catholics, Lutherans, Anglicans and Methodists, among others, often help one another clean the graves of cemeteries, along with adorning them with flowers.

All Souls' Day emphasizes the Christian belief in bodily resurrection and eternal life". Some All Souls' Day traditions are associated with the doctrine of the poor souls of purgatory (in Roman Catholicism) or the intermediate state (in Protestantism and Orthodoxy). Bell tolling is done in honor of the dead as well as lighting candles which serves to kindle a light for the poor souls.

Liturgical Minister Training - Fall 2025

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

A Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.

You may not take EMHC Part A and the Lector Workshop on the same day.


