

From Fr. Mike's Desk

HAPPY EASTER! This weekend we celebrate the most important day on the Christian Calendar. Today we are shown the whole reason Christ became one of us as an infant in Bethlehem, a child in Nazareth, and the carpenter who went around the Holy Land preaching the Good News. This weekend God's plan comes almost to completion. Sin has been conquered, spiritual death is destroyed, and we have been given an invitation to participate in Eternal Life. This Easter Day is so important that we celebrate it for Fifty Days, which brings us to the Church's Birthday, Pentecost.

Easter is so important that the Church provides us with three Gospels. This year one is Mark's Gospel taken from the Easter Vigil, for the day we see John's Gospel, and a selection from Luke's Gospel. Each one presents us with a different aspect of the Easter Message, and Mystery, and each one ends with joy.

Mark tells us of how the women (who were going to the tomb to complete the purification rituals for Jesus' body) come to the tomb and find that the great stone was removed. They come closer and see a young man in a white robe. He tells the women, not to be amazed and that Jesus has been raised. They were to go and tell the Apostles that they would see Him in Galilee.

Easter Morning tells us how Mary Magdalen came to the tomb early in the morning and likewise saw the stone rolled away, and that when she looked in, she did not see the Lord's Body. She runs to Peter and the others and tells them that Jesus has been taken from the tomb. Both Peter and the beloved disciple (scholars believe this is St. John) arrived at the tomb and went in. Peter does not seem to know what to make of it. But John sees the clothes that were around His head neatly rolled up and placed on the shelf. This helped him to know that Jesus did indeed rise from the dead. Again, a message for us to spread. They returned to the room where Jesus would appear to them that same evening.

Our Gospel for Easter Afternoon comes from Luke's Gospel, and it has one of my favorite accounts. This account is called "The Road to Emmaus." After they heard that Jesus' Body was not found in the tomb, two of His disciples walked from Jerusalem to a village seven miles away called Emmaus. They certainly did not know what to make of the stories being told and they refused to believe them. So, as they are going along the road, they are discussing what the accounts say. A stranger comes upon them and asks them about what they are talking about. The two cannot believe that this stranger has no idea about what they are talking about. Then they shared with the stranger what had happened and how frustrated they were. They were hoping that Jesus would be the Messiah. How could the Messiah die on the Cross? They were dumbfounded. The stranger replies by telling them how God's plan for salvation could only be achieved by the

Messiah's death and resurrection. Then starting with Moses and all the prophets he told them God's plan. The two later would say were not our hearts on fire as he spoke!

As they came to the village the stranger gave the impression that he was going farther, but they insisted that he stay. So, when they were at table, he took the bread and blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them. With that, they knew He was Jesus and they recognized Him in the breaking of the bread. And then He disappeared. The two ran back to Jerusalem and went to the upper room where they were greeted with the Lord has truly been raised..." Just as Jesus appeared in the breaking of the bread, He appears for us each time we celebrate and participate at Mass.

Christ has Risen He is truly Risen. And we have risen with Him. All humanity has been called to eternal life. Make the most of this weekend, and for the Fifty Days to follow.

On behalf of Fr. Hyacinth, Fr. Jude, Msgr. Beckmann, Deacon Jim, Deacon Barry, and the entire staff of St. Edward's, we wish you a Happy Easter. God bless you always.



Next Week's Gospel Question

In John's Gospel we hear how the Apostles encountered the risen Christ and believed in Him. They went to tell Thomas who, when told, did not believe, and wanted physical proof that Jesus had indeed risen. Upon seeing Jesus for himself, Thomas also believed.

We may say that Thomas' faith in Jesus was not that strong. Yet, a faith that doubts and asks questions is stronger than a faith which never thinks. If you sometimes have doubts and questions about your belief in the risen Jesus, what does that say about your faith?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Happy Easter to you and your families! Thank you for your love for the inspired Word of God. Thank you for your love for the Resurrection appearances of our Lord in this Easter season and the way your lives are set on fire in your meditation and contemplation of these mysteries.

Thank you for your fidelity to the Eucharist and the Sunday Mass and your Catholic spirit of evangelization. Thank you for being instruments of Eucharistic Revival.

In *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis states: "Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated the world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force...Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history...Such is the power of the resurrection, and all who evangelize are instruments of that power." (276)

We continue to live through "the storms of history" and we rely on the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds in Ukraine, the Middle East, Nicaragua, Venezuela, Armenia and Azerbaijan, the region of the Sahel, the Horn of Africa and Sudan, as well as Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, South Sudan and so many other troubled areas of the world. We ask the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds experienced in our own country.

In *The Everlasting Man*, G.K. Chesterton captured the power of our Lord's Resurrection experienced in the cycles of history. He wrote: "Christendom has had a series of revolutions and in each one of them Christianity has died. Christianity has died many times and risen again; for it had a God who knew the way out of the grave."

This Easter and every Easter we celebrate this Everlasting Man who knew his way out of the grave and who invites us and the Catholic Church on Long Island to a great Resurrection.

Liturgical Minister Training-Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One must attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.
