From Fr. Mike's Desk

This weekend we come to the end of our Christmas season and the beginning of Ordinary Time. Every year we make this transition with the celebration of *The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord* at the Jordan by St. John the Baptist. In today's Gospel, Mark does not provide us with any reason why Jesus goes to John. However, some scholars believe Jesus went to John to provide an example for us to follow. If He, who is without sin, humbly submits to John's Baptism, how much more should we do the same? Of course *the Sacrament of Baptism* carries with it much more than what John did at the Jordan. John's Baptism was one of repentance, and a pledge on the part of the person receiving it that he or she would amend their lives. It was a foreshadowing of the Baptism that comes to us through the life, death and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ and by the working of the Church. The Sacrament of Baptism **has an eternal impact on our lives**, as it changes us and makes us one with Christ and makes us dwelling places of the Holy Spirit. Through Baptism we become members of Christ's Living Body, the Church, and we are set free from being slaves to sin and darkness.

As we see in the reading from the *Acts of the Apostles*, St. Peter is called to the house of Cornelius, who is a Gentile, and to make matters worse, a Roman Centurion. But Cornelius and his family have come to believe in Jesus, and he so much wants to be baptized. As Peter comments, *"In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him."* Baptism then is to be offered to all who seek it, no matter where he or she comes from, and no matter what their past lives were like! When we receive this Sacrament, we can do as St. John tells us in his First Letter (an optional reading for today); we can love God and obey His commandments. As he writes, *"For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith."* God accomplishes this through

us, His Church. As stated all who seek Baptism are invited to come and follow the example Jesus gave us 2021 years ago at the Jordan River.

At the end of this month, we will celebrate *Catholic Schools Week*, and it promises to be a great week. We will have Open House hours where you can come and tour the school and see all the good things that **St. Edward's School** has to offer your children, grandchildren, cousins, and neighbor's kids. During this week you can meet with our principal, Mr. Vincent Albrecht, and many of our teachers. A Catholic Education provides a child with all they need to know about this world, and with all they need to know about the world to come. It provides them with all the tools they need to change the world, and to do their part in building up the church and the Kingdom of God. **Please feel free to call the school at (516) 921-7767; you will be happy you did.**

Let us pray: Almighty, ever-living God, who when Christ had been baptized by John in the River Jordan and the Holy Spirit descended upon Him, declared Him your beloved Son. Grant that we your children by adoption, reborn in water and the Holy Spirit may always be pleasing to you. Also, grant that we may be inwardly transformed through Him who we recognize as your Son made flesh. For He lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen

Let Christ's Light Shine in Love for One Another

Last Sunday Pope Francis prayed the Angelus on the Solemnity of the Epiphany, and invited us to proclaim the Gospel by allowing God's light of love to shine for others to see.

Standing in the library of the Apostolic Palace, the Pope reflected on the light which the liturgical feast brings to our world. He said Epiphany celebrates the same mystery as Christmas—the birth of Christ—but from the perspective of light and the manifestation of the Lord to all peoples. That light, the Pope noted, should be “welcomed in faith and the light to bring to others in charity, through witness, in the proclamation of the Gospel.” Reflecting on Isaiah's vision (60:1-6), Pope Francis said the prophet's description of his time is more relevant than ever: “darkness covers the earth, and thick darkness the peoples.” In such obscurity, the prophet Isaiah announced the coming of “the light given by God to Jerusalem and destined to shine on the path of all the peoples.” The Pope said this attractive vision invites hope, and reminds us that God's light overcomes all shadow of darkness.

We Need Your Help

We have **good news** and **bad news**... The **good news** is that we are starting to see a slow but steady increase in the number of people who are coming back to Mass on Sundays. We are so happy to see you again and we look forward to having everyone back together as a faith community. Now the **bad news**... the Federal Communication Commission is phasing out the 600 MHz frequencies currently in use by many Church congregations including St. Edward's. What this means is that our current sound system will not be able to comply or function with the new required frequency. Our sound system, which has served us well until recently, is the same system originally installed when our church was built, and includes the Holy Family Room and Auditorium. It has become antiquated and has failed several times. Replacement parts are virtually nonexistent. As a result of this and the FCC regulation, we must replace our sound system for the church, Holy Family room and Auditorium. Unfortunately, this does not come without a considerable cost. The best estimate we have received is approximately \$40,000. This could not have come at a worse time. Although we are blessed by your kind generosity, our weekly collections are lower than anticipated and as you know our fundraisers have been cancelled because of the pandemic.

So, we need your help! I am asking you to consider being a donor to help defray the cost of this system. I know times are tough for many and we are experiencing the need to tighten our belts as well, but the sound system is imperative for our liturgical services and school functions.

Please consider helping the parish out. Thanks and God bless!

Protection of Children and Young People – Background Screening Update

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People:

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

1. Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)
2. Sign the Codes of Conduct;
3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5 yr. intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

1. Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org
2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct- provided during the Virtus registration process.
3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application background offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened you may be at – or beyond- the *5yr. rescreening requirement*. If this is the case, you will receive an email from *Sterling Volunteers* asking you to complete the background screening application on-line. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. *Please be aware-this is not a scam nor has your e-mail been hacked*. The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically resign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Edit Your Virtus Account:


