

## The Readings for The Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

#### Reading 1 - 1 Samuel 3:3b-10,19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you, " Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am, " he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

#### **Reading 2 – 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20**

Brothers and sisters:

The body is not for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body; God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power.

Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? But whoever is joined to the Lord becomes one Spirit with him. Avoid immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore glorify God in your body.

#### Gospel – John 1:35-42

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher -, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" - which is translated Christ -... Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" which is translated Peter.

## **Prayer to St. Michael**

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

## From Fr. Mike's Desk

Our antiphon for this week's Responsorial Psalm is: "Here am I lord; I come to do your will." This phrase sets the tone for today's readings. The tone is one of being called by God, and the human response to that call. Samuel's call is one of the most popular, especially for those who have been called to Religious Life or Ordained Ministry. We know the story of how Samuel (who was consecrated to God by his parents before he was born) was left at the temple (not the one in Jerusalem which was not built then). While he was sleeping, he heard his name called. He quickly responded, "Here I am" and he went in to see if Eli the priest had called him. Eli told him that he did not call the boy, and he told him to go back to sleep. This same series of events happened again two more times, and with that Eli realized that it was God calling Samuel. So, Eli told him, what to do if he is called again. Eli told Samuel to answer with these words, "Speak, for your servant is listening." From that point on, the Lord kept calling Samuel, and helped him grow in holiness. God appointed Samuel judge over Israel, and he held the position longer than any other.

This all occurred because Samuel answered the call and was not afraid to go where God wanted him to go. The Gospel today also gives us the Divine Call for the first apostles. Likewise, this is a very familiar story, but it too has great meaning to those who are called. This time the calling is more of a pointing out. John the Baptist sees Jesus coming out of the desert and points Him out to two of his own disciples. He told them, "Behold the Lamb of God" and immediately they followed Jesus. When Our Lord noticed that they were following Him, He asked them what they wanted, and from that time on they stayed with Him and followed Jesus. They were so filled with the new call that they brought Jesus to meet Peter, who answered Jesus' call. Now I know that I wrote above that these readings strike a special note for those of us in Religious Life or Ordained Ministry, and they do, but the call of God is not restricted to those who enter these ministries. The call of God the Father, or Our Lord Jesus Christ is meant for all people and it is given to us through the power and grace of the Holy Spirit. Every baptized person is called by God to spread the Gospel and as we will see next week, become "Fishers of Men." Every person who knows God is called to share their faith in the One, True God! As we began this new secular year seventeen days ago,

we are being challenged by God to make Him known better than we ever did before, especially in these days of doubt and crisis.

At the end of this month we will celebrate *Catholic Schools Week*. Now usually we have the school open on that Sunday for all to visit. This year because of conditions we will curtail some of what we do. There will be tours of the school, but they will be made by appointment. ## Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 43 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The Baptism of the Lord, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

This first week of January can rightly be called the week of American Saints, and right now we can use all the help we can get! On January 4<sup>th</sup>, we celebrated the feast of Elizabeth Ann Seton who was the first American born citizen to be named a saint. On January 5<sup>th</sup>, we celebrated the feast of Saint John Neumann who was born in Bohemia, which is now the Czech Republic. He studied in Europe and received the minor orders of the Church but was not ordained a priest. His desire was to come to the United States to bring the Gospel to those in the country who did not speak English. He spoke German and learned several other languages so he could be of use. When he first arrived here, he was told there was no place for him, so he had to stand by. But eventually a need did arise in Western New York and so he was ordained in the old St. Patrick's Cathedral and sent to upstate New York. He was welcomed by the German speaking Catholics in that region and they wanted him to stay, but God had different plans for him. He joined the Redemptorist, where he was happy with his service to God, but that did not last too long, as he was named the fourth Bishop of Philadelphia where he remained until his death. Even though he was born and raised in Europe, he is considered an American Saint because he died here and carried out his pastoral ministry totally here in the United States. Saint John is the first American Bishop to be named a saint, and he is the first American male to be named a saint.

Both saints were very active in establishing Catholic Schools. St. Elizabeth was asked by Bishop John Carroll (the first Bishop of the United States) to establish a school in the Baltimore area, which she did. She also founded other schools as well, and her order grew with new members. St. John established the first diocesan Catholic School system and he spread Catholic Education to as many places that he could. He also established more outreach to serve the poor, marginal groups, and in general all Catholics in an environment which was anti-Catholic and anti-immigrant.

There is one more saint that is remembered on January 6<sup>th</sup>. That is Saint Andre Bessette, and while he was not from the United States, he was from Canada, and he was called the Miracle Man of Montreal. He was a simple man who struggled to be a member of the Congregation of the Holy Cross, but at first, he was rejected. Thanks to the help of the Bishop, he was eventually allowed to become a member of the order. He was given the lowly job of porter, sacristan, and he worked in the laundry. He carried out these duties for 40 years until he died. He always stressed a strong faith in Saint Joseph, and he would recommend him to people in physical, emotional, and spiritual need. During a time of a local epidemic, St. Andre volunteered to nurse people and no one under his care, died. This and many more miracles were part of his life. St. Andre was also instrumental in the building of an oratory in honor of St. Joseph. It was a simple little building that is still standing, but it now sits next to a very large, beautiful St. Joseph's Oratory. While not a citizen of the United States, he is a saint from North America, and we can certainly use his prayers of intercession especially in the light or darkness of the current pandemic. Let us also ask the prayers of Saint Joseph (as this is the year of Saint Joseph, who is the patron saint of the Universal Church). Let us ask these American Saints to pray for us, to help us in educating the young people, serving the poor, and healing the sick. Let us ask them to pray for peace and mutual understanding in our nation during this time.

## We Need Your Help

We have **good news** and **bab news**... The **good news** is that we are starting to see a slow but steady increase in the number of people who are coming back to Mass on Sundays. We are so happy to see you again and we look forward to having everyone back together as a faith community. Now the **bab news**... the Federal Communication Commission is phasing out the 600 MHz frequencies currently in use by many Church congregations including St. Edward's. What this means is that our current sound system will not be able to comply or function with the new required frequency. Our sound system, which has served us well until recently, is the same system originally installed when our church was built, and includes the Holy Family Room and Auditorium. It has become antiquated and has failed several times. Replacement parts are virtually nonexistent. As a result of this and the FCC regulation, we must replace our sound system for the church, Holy Family room and Auditorium. Unfortunately, this does not come without a considerable cost. The best estimate we have received is approximately \$40,000. This could not have come at a worse time. Although we are blessed by your kind generosity, our weekly collections are lower than anticipated and as you know our fundraisers have been cancelled because of the pandemic.

So, we need your help! I am asking you to consider being a donor to help defray the cost of this system. I know times are tough for many and we are experiencing the need to tighten our belts as well, but the sound system is imperative for our liturgical services and school functions.
