



From Fr. Mike's Desk

Last weekend we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and the end of the Christmas Season. As we noted last week, one of the reasons why Jesus came to be baptized by John, even though He was without sin, was to be in solidarity with us. Christ shares with us our need to grow closer to God and lead us to the Father who sent Him. Just as John the Baptist was preparing us for the Messiah's coming, he now takes a new step in pointing Jesus out to His first disciples. John tells them to, "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world." For Jesus is the one, the true lamb who will bring true salvation to the whole world.

You will no doubt recall how the Sacrificial Lamb was so important to Israel. It was the lamb, which was sacrificed at the Temple of Jerusalem. Likewise, it was the Passover Lamb whose blood was painted over the door posts that saved the first born of the Jews in Egypt, when the Angel of death seeing the blood, passed over their homes. Thus, when we call Jesus the Lamb of God, we are acknowledging the great gift God has given us through the spilling of His blood on the Cross. Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross takes away our sins and leads us to the eternal life of Easter. He continues the saving action in the giving us His Body and Blood. Keep in mind that the Eucharist is the Bloodless Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. This is why we pray before we receive Jesus, "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him who takes away the sins of the world, blessed are those who are called to the Supper of the Lamb..."

As mentioned above, last Sunday was the last day of the Christmas Season, and this week we are beginning the Second Week of Ordinary Time. What Ordinary Time does is orient us, "orders us" to our mission. The Bishop of the Diocese (Bishop Barres) is called the Ordinary. This is not a reflection of his talents, holiness, or abilities, but the title serves as a description of his task: to order the people of God for our common work. Therefore, Ordinary Time helps us to organize our thoughts and intentions and common commitments toward the work Christ gives us. This is what we will be doing for the next few weeks, until we enter the Holy Season of Lent, followed by the Easter Triduum and then the 50 Days of Easter, and once again return to Ordinary Time until next Advent.

Next Sunday we begin *Catholic Schools Week*, and during this week, we celebrate throughout the Church Community the great gift of Catholic Schools. We are very blessed to have our own *Saint Edward's School*. Our school offers an excellent education in all the ways of the world, but most importantly, it offers a wonderful education in the ways of the world to come. Your children or grandchildren will learn about their faith and God's plan for them. Please contact our *Principal Mr. Albrecht* at the school to arrange a tour during the week. You can reach him at (516) 921-7767, you will be very happy you did.

In a few weeks from today, we will begin our kickoff for the 2020 Catholic Ministries' Appeal. Please be as generous as you can be as the gifts you make to this appeal help support the many varied ministries throughout the Diocese. Bv supporting the appeal, you are *supporting* Religious Education, Catholic Schools, training for Liturgical Ministers, Catholic Hospitals, Catholic Charities, and the formation of Lay Leaders and those who are called to the Priesthood and Diaconate. Express Love Through Your Actions

During his homily on January 10th Pope Francis reflected on the liturgical reading of the day, taken from the First Letter of St. John the Apostle, which focusses on the topic of love. The apostle, the Pope said, understood what love is, experienced it, and as he entered into the heart of Jesus, he understood how it manifested itself. In his Letter, he continued, he tells us how we love and how we have been loved. First of all, the Pope explained, is the fact that "We love God because He loved us first." Love, he continued, stems from Him: "I begin to love, or I can begin to love because I know that He loved me first". And, he added, "If He had not loved us we certainly could not love." If a newborn child could speak, he would certainly express the fact that he feels loved by his parents. Parents love their child just as God loves us...He loved us first. And this gives birth to and increases our capacity to love," he said.

Pope Francis then reflected on another aspect that can stop people from loving: their wish not "to meddle" in the lives of others. This too, he said is not good, because love "expresses itself by doing good." True love, he explained, is expressed in everyday life, with its problems, its feelings of affection and dislike. Remember, the Pope said quoting from Saint Albert Hurtado, 'It is good not to do evil, but it is bad not to do good', true love, he said "must lead you to do good, to dirty your hands in works of love."

Let each of us dirty our hands with works of love!
