




### From Fr. Mike's Desk

Our first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, tells us, "First the Lord degraded the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali; but in the end he has glorified the seaward road, the land west of the Jordan, the District of the Gentiles. Anguish has taken wing, dispelled is darkness: for there is no gloom where but now there was distress. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great *light..."* Matthew's Gospel repeats this prophecy, as we read his version of the call of the first disciples. In fact, the prophecy actually stands on its own as we look at the shorter version of today's Gospel. As we read, "When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee." He left Nazareth and moved to Capernaum by the sea in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what the prophet said would be fulfilled. As Matthew writes, "...the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light..." "From that time on, Jesus began to preach, and say, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.""

Why does the prophet predict that the Messiah will go to the Land of the Gentiles? Why does Matthew want you to see that Jesus is fulfilling the prophecy in a place where nobody would expect? The answer is the whole region of Galilee throughout a large part of its history was the dwelling place of many Gentiles. Yes, Jews lived there as well, but so many of the people and the cities had foreign influences. The people were Arabs, Romans, Greeks, and people from many different places. It was a place where Judaism lived alongside other religious beliefs (like no place else in the Holy Land). It was a great commercial center and its chief export was fish, as many types lived in the Sea of Galilee. It also was a quiet place in terms of the Roman Empire, the Kingdom of Herod the Great, and his sons. However, it had a bad reputation and some would say that it was well earned. So why does Jesus start His public ministry there? Well, this was the place where He was most needed, for so many were living in darkness. Many did not know God, and many had a lukewarm faith. Many also had suffered at the hands of the Scribes and the Pharisees (the very people who were the leaders, and instead of leading the people closer to God they put up walls between the people and God). It is here that Jesus proclaims the Kingdom of God. The people now hear the word of God preached to them by God Himself and if they responded, they are now no longer living in darkness. Galilee was such a crossroads of cultures and society, so that whatever happened there would spread throughout the whole Roman world.

This is why Jesus started His ministry in Galilee, but it was not going to remain there, it was going to be preached all over the world, starting in the Holy Land. The disciples would accomplish this spreading the word throughout the world. They were the people who no one would expect to be picked. After all, they were fishermen, who knew what there was to know around the Sea of Galilee. However, keep in mind, that Peter, Andrew, and the father of James and John ran their own business and owned the equipment that they used for their business. Therefore, while they may have been simple people they were not stupid people. Also, keep in mind that Andrew and John were disciples of John the Baptist, and they were awaiting the coming of the Messiah. John pointed out Jesus to them, so it is no surprise that Jesus would call these men to follow Him, especially after they saw the great catch of fish. This call did not just go out to the twelve, but to the whole Church. It goes out to you and me. So get your nets ready, for the great catch of people who are still living in darkness; and will lead them to Jesus and He then leads them into the Kingdom of Light.

This Sunday we begin *Catholic Schools Week*, and during this week, we celebrate throughout the Church Community the great gift of Catholic Schools. We are very blessed to have our own *Saint Edward's School*. Our school offers an excellent education in all the ways of the world, but most importantly, it offers a wonderful education in the ways of the world to come. Your children or grandchildren will learn about their faith and God's plan for them. Please contact our *Principal, Mr. Albrecht* at the school to arrange a tour during this week. Pope Francis has declared this Third Sunday of Ordinary time as Word of God Sunday. It is perfect because Jesus is the Word of God and He is proclaiming the Father and Himself by starting His Public Ministry as we have seen this week.

### The Essence of Our Life

Pope Francis delivered his homily on 2/17/20 based on Jesus' miraculous healing of the paralytic in St. Mark's Gospel. Unable to approach Jesus in the packed house in Capernaum, the four men lowered the paralytic on a mat from the roof. The Pope drew attention to the first words of Jesus: **"Your sins are forgiven."** Jesus later orders him to get up, take up his mat and go home. Jesus, a man of God, the Pope said, heals but He is not a medicine man. He teaches but is more than a teacher and in this episode, He focuses on what is essential. The Pope said that physical health is a gift that we must preserve but the Lord teaches us that we must also preserve the health of the heart, spiritual health.

The words of Jesus to the paralytic, the Pope said, can help us in this. Jesus tells him, "Child, your sins are forgiven." The Pope noted that we get so used to this medicine of forgiveness of our sins and mistakes that it gets watered down and loses the strength and the power of prophecy of Jesus when He focusses on the essential. And today Jesus tells each one of us: "I want to forgive your sins".

The Pope further pointed out that perhaps someone may not find sins to confess because "there is a lack of awareness of sins". The medicine needed to be healed from "concrete sins", "diseases of the soul", the Pope said, is forgiveness. Watching over our body and the soul, he said, we go to that Doctor who can heal us, who can forgive our sins. He is Jesus who came for this and gave His life for this, the Pope said.
