Reading 1 - Job 7:1-4, 6-7

Job spoke, saying:

Reading 2 – 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

Brothers and sisters:

I should like you to be free of anxieties. An unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord. But a married man is anxious about the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided. An unmarried woman or a virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy in both body and spirit. A married woman, on the other hand, is anxious about the things of the world, how she may please her husband. I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction.

Gospel – Mark 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.

When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him.

Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.

From Fr. Mike's Desk

This week's Gospel Reading starts off from where we left off last week, as it tells us that Jesus leaving the synagogue, where He drove the unclean spirit out of the man, entered the house of Simon. When He arrived, He was informed that Simon's mother-in-law was sick with a fever. He went immediately to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. The fever left her, and she began to wait on them. While we are not sure of the seriousness of the fever, it most likely could have been a matter of life or death. So, there is more to this healing miracle then meets the eye. Jesus does more than cure her; He raises her up, which in part foreshadows the Resurrection, but this is also a sign of restoring her to a full life. Simon's mother-in-law is now given the ability to be reinstated as a participating member of the community of Israel, and now she can once again give full praise to God by offering her service, especially to the one who God sent. Therefore, she begins to wait on Jesus and the disciples. She is so grateful, but she is also fulfilling the call of every child of God, which is to give service to one another. This should make perfect sense to us. because we know when we are ill or there is something troubling us, we are not ourselves and we cannot function. This is because we do not have the energy, or we cannot focus our thoughts on what we need to accomplish for God or the common good.

In every healing miracle, there is always more than meets the eye. Each one points us to the restoration of a whole life and are signs of the new life of the Resurrection. That is why Mark informs us that Jesus cured many who were sick that night and continued to expel more demons (not allowing them to speak). Mark tells us that early the next morning, before dawn, Jesus goes off to pray and when the disciples found Him, they implore Him to return to town for everyone was looking for Him. The people of the town did not want Jesus to leave, who would? But Jesus does not want to go backwards, and so He tells the disciples that they must move on to other towns, so more people can hear the Good News, and so He and the disciples move on.

Saint Paul in his First Letter to the Corinthians, tells us that we must be like him and the disciples when it comes to us preaching the Gospel. In short, Paul is telling us we should try to do it with joy and not look for recompense. We receive joy

in knowing that we are doing what we are supposed to do. But Paul does acknowledge that at times it is hard; however, he does not stop preaching because it is an act of stewardship. Either way he is doing what he knows the Lord commands. We will be able to preach and live out the Good News and help people receive the healing they need in health, mind, and spirit.

One of the ways we can do both is supporting the Catholic Ministries Appeal and next weekend I will be speaking at all the Masses about how we can help this worthwhile appeal. Through the Catholic Ministries Appeal, we can help so many ministries in our Diocese preach the Gospel and teach about Jesus and we can help so many carry out the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. Please pray about your contribution and remember when we help others, we also help ourselves and our wonderful parish of Saint Edward's. Our goal for this year is \$105,500. I know we will be able to make it because we know how much good it does. If we reach 100% of our goal, we will receive back over \$23,000 and that helps us to balance our budget.

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 46 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

This weekend is the last weekend of January and the last day of the first month of 2021. One could say that this was not a dull month because of the many different events that occurred. I do hope that this new month will be less exciting!

This coming month of February carries with it many traditions that we usually uphold. For example, the second of the month is Ground Hog Day. Ground Hog day, when one of the largest members of the squirrel family is forced to wake up early and predict the remainder of our winter weather; depending on whether he sees his shadow. There are several of these large rodents who predict the weather and they do not always agree. The famous one is Punxsutawney Phil, but there is also Staten Island Chuck, Malverne Mel, and Holtsville Hal, who knew? February 2nd is also the Feast Day of the Presentation of the Lord. It is on this day in many other countries that the Christmas Creches are taken down, just before we begin the Season of Lent. On February 3rd, we celebrate the feast day of St. Blase, and the blessings of throats. However, this year thanks to our favorite virus, we will only be doing it universally. This means we will not place the 2 crossed candles at your throat as we usually do. Rather we will extend our hands over the whole congregation and say the special blessing.

Then of course February gives us Valentine's Day on Sunday the 14th. A great day to celebrate the love couples/people have for one another, and a great day to celebrate the Eucharist. But before we get carried away, the following Wednesday, the 17th is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Well at least Valentine's Day is not on Ash Wednesday as it was a few years ago. The week of the 14th is also President's Week and the mid-winter recess. As a result, the kids will be off from school. Maybe some families will even travel. Thus, we have decided that because of this and many other factors our Ash Wednesday Schedule will be different from past years. We will tell you more about Ash Wednesday when we get closer to the day.

February is also Black History Month, and we use this month to look back and see the great contributions made to the United States by African Americans. We see the struggles, and injustices that black people had to endure and in so many cases are still facing. We see how so many African Americans fought in our country's wars from the Revolutionary War to the Wars against Terror, and we likewise see how they used their labors to build this country and still do. We also see great Americans like Frederick Douglas, Booker T. Washington, George Washington Carver, Harriet Tubman, Rosa Parks, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and so many more.

February is, of course, the shortest month of the year, which is good because in most years it is the coldest month of the winter and sometimes it is the month with the most snow. Let us hope that this February will not have any surprises, and if we do may they be pleasant for each of us.

Ash Wednesday - Distribution of Ashes



This year, Ash Wednesday, falls on February 17th. It is the beginning of the most solemn period in the Church calendar leading up to the joyous celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Because of the Pandemic the diocese will not permit us to distribute of the ashes in the usual way. In an effort to avoid close physical contact we will not be marking individual foreheads with ash. Rather, we will be distributing the ashes in small individual bags at each of our liturgies during the day. These will be:

Morning Prayer at 7:00 am Mass at 9:00 am Mass at 12:30 pm Mass at 7:00 pm

Since school will not be in session there will be no 4:30 prayer service. Bags of ashes will be available throughout the day and left in baskets in the vestibule of the church. We ask you to please limit the number of bags you take to what you actually need. Left over ashes should be spread in garden beds or lawns.

As we journey together through this Lenten season, let us call to mind all our brothers and sisters on Long Island who are in need. One of the ways we can assist our neighbors and the Church is through giving to the Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA).
