

Reading 1 - Jerimiah 17:5-8

From Fr. Mike's Desk

In Matthew's Gospel, one of the main events is the Sermon on the Mount. In this account, Matthew has Jesus climbing up to the top of the mountain so that all could hear Him. Matthew makes a direct connection between Moses and Jesus, for just as Moses went up to Mt. Sinai to receive the Ten Commandments, so does Jesus go up the mountain to deliver the Beatitudes. The difference between the two is that Moses receives the commandments from God and Jesus delivers the Beatitudes based on His authority as the Son of Luke also has Jesus delivering the Beatitudes, only it does not happen on a mountain top, but on the crossroads or on the plains (as it is known as the Sermon on the Plains). Now we may ask did Jesus give two sermons with the same message. That is entirely possible after all. There was no mass communication in those days. On the other hand, perhaps it is true that Luke's special source had the sermon-taking place somewhere else. Or maybe Luke wants to make a point about who Jesus directs the sermon to, and where it happened. Luke's setting on the plains or the crossroads, makes it a place where many people come and go, and where many types of different people would mix (Jews and Gentiles alike). Luke wants people from all over the world to hear the words of Jesus, and if they can understand them put them into practice. There is another difference between the two accounts; Matthew has Jesus intending to teach the whole assembled crowd, whereas Luke has Jesus speaking primarily to the twelve. However, he does hint that anyone who cared to listen could and would spread the good news.

In Luke's account, we see Jesus is very concerned with those who are poor, hungry, homeless, weeping, and all the established society hates and pushes aside. Luke wants all to know that Jesus has come into the world to change the world, as well as free us from sin and darkness. As Luke sees it, to neglect the poor is, indeed, a great sin. Matthew also speaks about this in his Chapter 25 when Jesus says "Whatsoever you do for the least of my brothers that you do unto me". Luke adds one more thing, **the woes!** We do not see them in Matthew's account of the sermon, but the woes point out to those who have everything, but do not help those who have not, they will suffer in the end.

Again, Jesus directs this message to the twelve

and anyone who has the good sense to listen. That, of course, means the Church, must take the words, act on them, and make a difference in the In other words all of us who are the Church must listen and do our part to change things. We are called to share our time, and talents to make things better. We are called to pray for the poor and for those who are persecuted and denied justice in this world, and we are also to pray for the peace and safety of the world. Likewise we are called to share our treasure so that we can help the Propagation of the Faith and other agencies of the Church. We are to share our treasure to help those who educate young and old alike, to maintain Catholic Hospitals and Nursing Homes especially in this time of COVID. We can do all of this through our participating in the Catholic Ministries Appeal. Our goal for this year is \$112,100.00 and if we reach our goal and go beyond, we will receive a rebate of over \$26,000.00. Please help by making a pledge and know that you are supporting so many vital parts of the Church's ministry right here on Long Island.

Let us then all pray that we can listen to the words of Jesus on the crossroads, the plains and on the mount and make a difference here in our parish, in our diocese and in the whole world.




