

From Fr. Mike's Desk

'Jesus said to his disciples; 'Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. Amen, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or the smallest part of a letter will pass from the law...'" "I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and the Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven."

Jesus uses some very strong words in today's gospel as He calls the disciples and the Church to recognize the truth of His mission. We get a fuller explanation of Jesus' teaching from commentary for today's readings found in the "2020 Edition of the Workbooks for Lector, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word" published by Liturgy Training Publications. Today Elaine Park, SSL, STD writes, "After Jesus describes his disciples as salt and light, he continues his sermon by explaining how they are to understand his teaching. He has come not to abolish the law but to bring it to fulfillment. Jesus could well reiterate this statement when his later actions seem to negate the convictions of his Jewish contemporaries on keeping God's law. He eats with sinners, cures on the Sabbath and does not enforce the traditions of the elders. Yet Jesus' words and his actions show that he is not in conflict with the law itself, but with how it is being interpreted. The law, understood and lived correctly, guides people in living righteously, or in right relationship, a virtue emphasized throughout Matthew's Gospel. Though external manifestations of righteousness are important, Jesus goes beyond external actions to consider the interior dispositions. Later in Matthew's Gospel, as Jesus' passion draws near, he explains the 'weightier things of the law: judgment, mercy, and fidelity.' These are the interior dispositions of righteousness that are the foundation for Jesus' view of the law. Jesus teaches through a series of antitheses, or contrast, the difference between his teaching about the law and what people have heard about the law. Far from abolishing the law, Jesus' teaching goes deeper, moving from external behavior to the righteousness of heart. In his first antithesis, Jesus states the law against killing. He regards anger and contemptible speech as already making a person guilty of transgressing the commandment. Therefore, Jesus' disciples should forgive from their hearts any wrongs against them and be reconciled with one another before

bringing their gifts to the altar of worship. When Jesus describes an image of a courtroom, he suggests a scene of the final judgement, where He alone is able to judge a person's heart.

Jesus' second antithesis again goes beyond the external keeping of the law. Like anger and contempt, which transgress the commandment again murder, lustful thoughts are sins against adultery. Jesus' interpretation of the prohibition against adultery includes guarding one's thoughts and senses that cause one to sin...literally making a person stumble. Jesus warns his disciples to avoid whatever is a source of stumbling. The (fourth) antithesis goes farther than the law that prohibits taking a false oath. Not only should Jesus' disciples avoid false oaths, they should not take an oath at all. Sworn testimony that calls upon God to witness is unnecessary because a simple yes or no should express the truth of a disciple's word, like that of Jesus himself."

These words are sometimes hard to hear or read, but as we see above through Elaine Park's commentary, they are necessary words for us to know if we are to be true disciples.

We close with the words from today's Psalm, "Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord! Blessed are they whose ways are blameless, who walk in the law of the Lord...Instruct me, O Lord, in the way of your statutes, that I may exactly observe them. Give me discernment, that I may observe your law and keep it with all my heart."

In the Words of Pope Francis

On January 28th Pope Francis reflected on the liturgical reading from the Gospel of Mark noting that it is full of advice for the faithful. Highlighting the passage that says "The measure with which you measure will be measured out to you," the Pope said that at some point of our lives, and especially at the end of our existence, we are all called to account for how we have lived our life. These words, he explained, "tell us exactly what that moment will be like", that is, how we will be judged. The Pope also noted that in Chapter 25 of Matthew's Gospel he tells us "what we have to do", and the style with which we have to live". By what measure do I measure others? By what measure do I measure myself? Is it a generous measure, full of God's love? Or is it a low level measure?" he said, underscoring the need to take stock not only of the bad or the good things we do, but of our daily lifestyle. A Christian who lacks the capacity to be humble, is not a true Christian. Jesus "humbled himself unto death." This is the model of humbleness we should strive for.

The cross powerfully captures the depth of the Christian message. Jesus' total surrender of self to the Father, and the Father's acceptance of Jesus' sacrifice centers on this symbol. 
