Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23

In those days, Saul went down to the desert of Ziph with three thousand picked men of Israel, to search for David in the desert of Ziph. So David and Abishai went among Saul's soldiers by night and found Saul lying asleep within the barricade, with his spear thrust into the ground at his head and Abner and his men sleeping around him.

Abishai whispered to David:

"God has delivered your enemy into your grasp this day. Let me nail him to the ground with one thrust of the spear; I will not need a second thrust!" But David said to Abishai, "Do not harm him, for who can lay hands on the LORD's anointed and remain unpunished?" So David took the spear and the water jug from their place at Saul's head, and they got away without anyone's seeing or knowing or awakening. All remained asleep, because the LORD had put them into a deep slumber.

Going across to an opposite slope, David stood on a remote hilltop at a great distance from Abner, son of Ner, and the troops. He said: "Here is the king's spear. Let an attendant come over to get it. The LORD will reward each man for his justice and faithfulness. Today, though the LORD delivered you into my grasp, I would not harm the LORD's anointed."

Gospel - Luke 6:27-38

Jesus said to his disciples: "To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same. If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount. But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and vou will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give, and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

When I was a kid reading my Batman or Superman comic books, with great joy I might add, I can remember that in almost every issue they had a public service message about following the Golden Rule. They had the rule written in many languages and from many different faith traditions. They stressed that it was indeed a universal human standard and way of life. The rule was highly endorsed by historic figures such as Rabbi Hillel and Confucius. The rule states: TREAT OTHERS AS YOU WISH TO BE TREATED! Really good words to live by and Jesus echoes them in today's Gospel, as we continue with the Sermon on The Plain. However, Jesus does not stop at the Golden Rule, He goes way beyond it as He tells us; "To you, who hear I say love your enemies, do good to those who mistreat you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on the cheek offer the other one as well." "Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them."

Now, we may say that Jesus is certainly correct. We should try to treat everyone the way we would want to be treated; but to treat those who are my enemies the same way, that is crazy or downright impossible. Well yes! According to basic human actions and reactions, it does not seem possible. It seems natural to protect yourself or those whom you love from those who hate or persecute you. The natural reaction is to protect yourself from people like this, and strike out first to prevent more harm. But this is not according to what Christ is calling us to. It is possible to forgive one's enemies and likewise do good for them, because through Jesus, we have seen a new way of living, a way that goes beyond the Golden Rule of humanity. Now we are living under the rule of Jesus, the Son of God, who we all belong to as living members of His Body the Church. God became one of us in the person of Jesus to show us what we as humans can truly accomplish. He reminds us that we are made in God's image and likeness and, therefore, we are to function as God does, not as the basic human actions and reactions would dictate. For to act according to basic human actions, is to follow Adam and Eve after they ate of the forbidden fruit, not the Adam and Eve as they were when first created. Christ shows and tells us that we can act just like Him, the new Adam, and just like His dear Mother, the new Eve.

We are not to seek vengeance and we are to offer forgiveness, for this is the only true way to change the world.

When we look at the world today, and the many acts of terror and suicide bombings, all we can clearly see are useless acts of violence which generate more acts of violence. Now, we ask, are we not supposed to protect ourselves? Yes, most certainly, but in protecting ourselves, we are not to seek an eye for an eye or a tooth for a tooth. No, it should be more. We will not allow others to harm us, and we will prevent others from harming innocent people, but we, likewise, hope to settle our differences by talking, by reacting differently and not seeking vengeance. Granted, this is hard to do, especially when it is one sided, yet we must try and persevere if anything is going to change. We see a good example of today's gospel in the actions of St. John Paul II, when he went to the cell of Mehmet Ali Agea, the person who shot him in 1981. Ali Agea was pardoned after serving 19 years of a life sentence at the behest of the late pope. Yes, it can be done, but we cannot do it without constant prayer and dedication to Jesus' words: "Merciful, just as your Father is merciful. Stop judging, and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven."

These powerful prayers are gifts from Heaven, and we should believe in their great promises. "Those who sincerely say 'Jesus, I trust in You' will find comfort in all their anxieties and fears".

LIKE THE SAINTS, LET US TURN TO ST. JOSEPH

During his General Audience this past Wednesday, Pope Francis continued his catechesis cycle on the figure of St Joseph, describing him as one who cares for others. The Pope explained that the Gospels provide us with the most correct interpretation. "At the end of every story in which Joseph is the protagonist", began the Pope, "the Gospel notes that he takes the Child and his mother with him and does what God has ordered him to do." He always does what he must to protect them both, noted the Pope.

Pope Francis explained that in God's plan of salvation, "the Son cannot be separated from the Mother", adding that the Second Vatican Council reminds us of this. "Jesus, Mary and Joseph are in a sense the primordial nucleus of the Church,"... and we too "must always ask ourselves whether we are protecting with all our strength Jesus and Mary, who are mysteriously entrusted to our responsibility, our care, our custody." God trusted Joseph, continued the Pope, as did Mary, as He always "took care of her and the Child."

Bringing his catechesis to a close, Pope Francis encouraged the faithful gathered to "ask for the intercession of St Joseph, precisely at the most difficult times in the life of you and of your communities." How many saints have turned to him, concluded the Pope. "Let us imitate their example."




