

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Sirach 27:4-7

When a sieve is shaken, the husks appear; so do one's faults when one speaks. As the test of what the potter molds is in the furnace, so in tribulation is the test of the just. The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had; so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks, for it is then that people are tested.

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

Gospel - Luke 6:39-45

Jesus told his disciples a parable,

"Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye.

"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For people do not pick figs from thornbushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles. A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Last week Jesus instructed us at the end of the Gospel to, "Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give and gifts will be given to you...For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you." Jesus does not suggest this to us, no He orders us to do so. Yet, at times, these are the hardest orders to follow. We all judge one another, condemn or are critical of others. For some it is easier to walk on hot coals then to forgive or apologize. Why is that? None of us really wants to be this way, well maybe Judge Judy! Jesus does give us a hint as to why we do this in today's Gospel. Jesus tells us today, "'Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit?" He then goes on to tell us that when we the disciples are fully trained, we will be just like the teacher. But it has been 2022 years since Jesus walked the earth and several thousand years before Jesus, that God spread the teaching of loving God and neighbor. So why do we still find ourselves judging, condemning, etc.? Is it because we are so busy looking at the splinter in our brothers and sisters' eyes, and so concerned about their failings and shortcomings, that we notice nothing else? When we do this, we cannot see their true goodness.

Jesus then comments, "'Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own?" Jesus is telling us, it is impossible to see others when we have more than a splinter in our own eyes, in fact how can we see anything clearly? Unless we remove the beam from our eyes, we will not be able to help our neighbor remove the splinter from his/her eye. However, how can I do this, for if I could, I would have done it a long time ago? Well, the great saints of the Church were able to do this, but so have the Church's little saints: people like you and me. How did they do it? We must turn to Jesus and listen to what He tells us, we must seek His forgiveness, and ask for a share of His compassion and gentleness. We must try to see beyond our brothers and sisters' faults and should not focus on our own faults. If we fixate on our own faults or do the opposite and say we have no faults, then the beam is going to grow into a house. Christ is calling us to be honest with ourselves, and with His help, we can. This honesty will allow us to see others as they are and help them to remove their splinters, beams, houses and

even neighborhoods, and it will help us do the same for ourselves. In this way, every good tree can bear good fruit and will not be mistaken for a bad tree with bad fruit.

This Wednesday, March 2 we will begin the Holy Season of Lent. It is a time to fast, abstain, and to take the time to look at our lives to see how well we have followed the teachings of Jesus. It is a time to reform our lives and as I say every year, a time for us to die to those things that are getting between God and ourselves. Our schedule for Ash Wednesday is 7AM Prayer Service with distribution of ashes; 9 AM Mass with ashes; 12Noon-12:20 Distribution of Ashes: 12:30 Mass with ashes, 7PM Mass with ashes. Between these scheduled services, we will have Eucharistic Ministers giving out ashes until the evening. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstaining from eating meat (likewise, we are to abstain on the Fridays of Lent). Please note that if you are 62 or over or have a condition that requires you to eat regularly you are excused from fasting. Please use this day well, do not come just to get ashes and that is it. Come, receive your ashes and if you go to Mass receive the Eucharist and resolve that this outward sign of the ashes will be a sign to you and others that you want to die to sin and rise to new life with Jesus on Easter.






